7 [state government - Department of Human Services -
8 exempting revenues and donations - requiring deposits -
9 effective date]

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

11 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2001, Section 85.12c, is
12 amended to read as follows:

13 Section 85.12c A. Purchases made from funds received by local
14 offices administered by the Department of Human Services for fund-
15 raising activities and donations for the benefit of clients and
16 potential clients at the local offices where such purchases may not
17 otherwise be paid for from appropriated funds, shall not be subject
18 to requirements of the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. Monies
19 received by such fund-raising activities or donations shall be
20 maintained in an Agency Special Account, and expenditure control
21 shall reside at the local offices. Monies received by such fund-
22 raising activities or donations from the local office, vending
23 operations administered by employees of the Department of Human
24 Services, and all other nonrestricted cash and cash-equivalent items
25 received by employees of the Department of Human Services shall be

1 deposited in the Agency Special Account established for this
2 purpose. Such deposits shall be made at local banking institutions
3 approved by the State Treasurer.

4 B. Purchases made from funds received by local offices
5 administered by the Office of Juvenile Affairs for fund-raising
6 activities and donations for the benefit of clients and potential
7 clients at the local offices where such purchases may not otherwise
8 be paid for from appropriated funds shall not be subject to
9 requirements of the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. Monies
10 received by such fund-raising activities or donations shall be
11 maintained in an agency special account, and expenditure control
12 shall reside at the local offices. Monies received by such fund-
13 raising activities or donations from the local office, vending
14 operations administered by employees of the Office of Juvenile
15 Affairs, and all other nonrestricted cash and cash-equivalent items
16 received by employees of the Office of Juvenile Affairs shall be
17 deposited in the agency special account established for this
18 purpose. The deposits shall be made at local banking institutions
19 approved by the State Treasurer.

20 C. Merchandise for resale purchased and sold through a canteen
21 established at an institution or facility operated by the Office of
22 Juvenile Affairs shall be exempt from the requirements of the
23 Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act.

1 D. Purchases and solicitations made from funds or assets
2 received in accordance with Section 2-106 of Title 43A of the
3 Oklahoma Statutes and administered by the Department of Mental
4 Health and Substance Abuse Services shall not be subject to
5 requirements of the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. Monies
6 received by such activities or donations shall be maintained in an
7 Agency Special Account, and expenditure control shall reside in a
8 trust created by the Department and with oversight by the Department
9 of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services Board. Such deposits
10 shall be made at local banking institutions approved by the State
11 Treasurer.

12 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2010.
