SENATE BILL NO. 1954 - By: Anderson of the Senate and Jackson of the House.

[motor vehicles - Task Force on the Motor Vehicle License Plate Delivery System - codification - effective date]

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1101.1 of Title 47, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. There is hereby created until December 1, 2011, the Task Force on the Motor Vehicle License Plate Delivery System. The task force shall study the delivery of services relating to motor vehicle registration and renewal, including the impact of online renewal on the delivery of services to consumers by motor license agents.

B. The task force shall be composed of the members of the Senate Finance Committee, the House Appropriations Committee on Revenue and Taxation, a designee of the Oklahoma Tax Commission and three additional members as follows:

1. One member appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, who shall represent a tag agent from a county with a

1 population in excess of one hundred thousand (100,000) persons
2 according to the most recent Federal Decennial Census;

3 2. One member appointed by the Speaker of the House of
4 Representatives, who shall represent a tag agent from a county in
5 this state with a population of less than one hundred thousand
6 (100,000) persons according to the most recent Federal Decennial
7 Census; and

8 3. One member appointed by the Governor, who shall represent
9 the taxpayers of the State of Oklahoma.

10 C. The chair and vice-chair of the task force shall be selected
11 by the task force from among the members.

12 D. A quorum of the task force shall be required in order for
13 any final action of the task force.

14 E. The task force may meet as often as may be required in order
15 to perform the duties imposed upon it.

16 F. Members of the task force shall receive no compensation for
17 their service, but shall receive travel reimbursement as follows:

18 1. Legislative members of the task force shall be reimbursed
19 for necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their
20 duties in accordance with the provisions of Section 456 of Title 74
21 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

22 2. Nonlegislative members of the task force shall be reimbursed
23 by their appointing authorities for necessary travel expenses

1 incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with the
2 State Travel Reimbursement Act.

3 H. Staff support for the task force shall be provided jointly
4 by the Senate and the House of Representatives.

5 I. The task force shall report its findings, including any
6 legislative recommendations to the President Pro Tempore of the
7 Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the
8 Governor by December 1, 2011.

9 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2010.
