4 SENATE BILL NO. 2290 - By: Lamb of the Senate and Carey of the
5 House.

6 An act relating to public safety; amending 47 O.S. 2001,
7 Sections 2-105, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 310,
8 O.S.L. 2009, 2-105.6, as last amended by Section 3, Chapter
9 83, 2nd Extraordinary Session, O.S.L. 2006, and 6-201, as
10 last amended by Section 5, Chapter 149, O.S.L. 2004 (47 O.S.
11 Supp. 2009, Sections 2-105, 2-106.5 and 6-201), which relate
12 to the Oklahoma Highway Patrol; changing names of certain
13 divisions; deleting language relating to the Lake Patrol
14 Division; amending 63 O.S. 2001, Section 4205, which relates
15 to water events; changing name of certain division; and
16 providing an effective date.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2001, Section 2-105, as
19 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 310, O.S.L. 2009 (47 O.S. Supp.
20 2009, Section 2-105), is amended to read as follows:

21 Section 2-105. A. The Commissioner of Public Safety, subject
22 to the Oklahoma Personnel Act, shall appoint:

23 1. A Chief of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division with the
24 rank of Colonel, Deputy Chiefs of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol
25 Division with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel, and subordinate
26 officers and employees of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division,
27 including Majors, Captains, Lieutenants, and Highway Patrolmen with
28 the rank of Trooper, who shall comprise the Oklahoma Highway Patrol
29 Division of the Department of Public Safety; provided, any officer

1 appointed to a commissioned position prescribed in this paragraph
2 which is unclassified pursuant to Section 840-5.5 of Title 74 of the
3 Oklahoma Statutes shall have a right of return to the highest
4 previously held classified commissioned position within the Highway
5 Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety without any loss
6 of rights, privileges or benefits immediately upon completion of the
7 duties in the unclassified commissioned position;

8 2. A Captain, Lieutenants, and Patrolmen who shall comprise the
9 ~~Lake Patrol~~ Marine Enforcement Section of the Oklahoma Highway
10 Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety;

11 3. A Captain, Lieutenants, and Patrolmen, who shall comprise
12 the Capitol Patrol Section of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division
13 of the Department of Public Safety; and

14 4. A Director of the Communications Division with the rank of
15 Captain, Communications Coordinators with the rank of First
16 Lieutenant, Communications Superintendents with the rank of Second
17 Lieutenant, Communications Supervisors with the rank of Sergeant,
18 Communications Dispatchers, Radio Technicians and Tower Maintenance
19 Officers who shall comprise the Communications Division of the
20 Department of Public Safety.

21 B. 1. The Commissioner, when appointing commissioned officers
22 and employees to the positions set out in subsection A of this
23 section, shall determine, in consultation with the Administrator of

1 the Office of Personnel Management, minimum qualifications and shall
2 select such officers and employees only after examinations to
3 determine their physical and mental qualifications for such
4 positions. The content of the examinations shall be prescribed by
5 the Commissioner, and all such appointees shall satisfactorily
6 complete a course of training in operations and procedures as
7 prescribed by the Commissioner.

8 2. No person shall be appointed to any position set out in
9 subsection A of this section unless the person is a citizen of the
10 United States of America, of good moral character, and:

11 a. for commissioned officer positions, shall be at least
12 twenty-one (21) years of age but less than forty-three
13 (43) years of age, and shall possess:

14 (1) an associate's degree or a minimum of sixty-two
15 (62) successfully completed semester hours from a
16 college or university which is recognized by and
17 accepted by the American Association of
18 Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers and
19 whose hours are transferable between such
20 recognized institutions, and

21 (2) for any person appointed to the Oklahoma Highway
22 Patrol Division on or after July 1, 2012:

- 1 (a) a bachelor's degree from a college or
2 university which is recognized by and
3 accepted by the American Association of
4 Collegiate Registrars and Admissions
5 Officers and whose hours are transferable
6 between such recognized institutions, or
7 (b) an associate's degree or a minimum of sixty-
8 two (62) successfully completed semester
9 hours from a college or university which is
10 recognized by and accepted by the American
11 Association of Collegiate Registrars and
12 Admissions Officers and whose hours are
13 transferable between such recognized
14 institutions, and:
15 i. at least two (2) years' experience as a
16 law enforcement officer certified by
17 the Council on Law Enforcement
18 Education and Training (C.L.E.E.T.) or
19 by the equivalent state agency in
20 another state or by any law enforcement
21 agency of the federal government, or
22 ii. at least two (2) years of honorable
23 military service in an active or

1 reserve component of the United States
2 Armed Forces.

3 Provided, such years of experience or service shall
4 have been consecutive and shall have been completed no
5 more than two (2) years prior to application for
6 appointment, or

7 b. for any such position in the Communications Division,
8 a person shall be at least twenty (20) years of age
9 and shall possess a high school diploma or General
10 Educational Development equivalency certificate; shall
11 possess either six (6) months of previous experience
12 as a dispatcher or fifteen (15) successfully completed
13 semester hours from a college or university which is
14 recognized by and accepted by the American Association
15 of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers and
16 whose hours are transferable between such recognized
17 institutions.

18 3. No commissioned officer of the Department shall, while in
19 such position, be a candidate for any political office or take part
20 in or contribute any money or other thing of value, directly or
21 indirectly, to any political campaign or to any candidate for public
22 office. Anyone convicted of violating the provisions of this

1 paragraph shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished as
2 provided by law.

3 4. The Commissioner or any employee of the Department shall not
4 be a candidate for any political office, or in any way be active or
5 participate in any political contest of any Primary, General, or
6 Special Election, except to cast a ballot. No commissioned officer
7 of the Department, while in the performance of the officer's
8 assigned duty of providing security and protection, shall be
9 considered as participating in a political campaign. The provisions
10 of this paragraph shall not be construed to preclude a commissioned
11 officer of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division of the Department of
12 Public Safety from being a candidate for a position on a local board
13 of education.

14 5. Drunkenness or being under the influence of intoxicating
15 substances shall be sufficient grounds for the removal of any
16 commissioned officer of the Department, in and by the manner
17 provided for in this section.

18 C. 1. Upon initial appointment to the position of Cadet
19 Highway Patrolman or Probationary Communications Dispatcher, the
20 appointed employee shall be required to serve an initial
21 probationary period of twelve (12) months. The Commissioner may
22 extend the probationary period for up to three (3) additional months
23 provided that the employee and the Office of Personnel Management

1 are notified in writing as to such action and the reasons therefor.
2 During such probationary period, the employee may be terminated at
3 any time and for any reason at the discretion of the Commissioner.
4 Retention in the service after expiration of the initial
5 probationary period shall entitle such employee to be classified as
6 a permanent employee and the employee shall be so classified. No
7 permanent employee may be discharged or removed except as provided
8 for in this section.

9 2. A commissioned officer of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol
10 Division may be promoted during the initial probationary period if
11 such officer satisfactorily completes all training requirements
12 prescribed by the Commissioner.

13 D. 1. No permanent employee, as provided for in this section,
14 who is a commissioned officer of the Department, may be suspended
15 without pay or dismissed unless the employee has been notified in
16 writing by the Commissioner of such intended action and the reasons
17 therefor. No such notice shall be given by the Commissioner unless
18 sworn charges or statements have been obtained to justify the
19 action.

20 2. Whenever such charges are preferred, the Commissioner may
21 suspend the accused pending the hearing and final determination of
22 such charges. If the charges are not sustained in whole or in part,
23 the accused shall be entitled to pay during the period of such

1 suspension. If the charges are sustained in whole or in part, the
2 accused shall not receive any pay for the period of such suspension.

3 3. Commissioned officers of the Department of Public Safety are
4 not entitled to appeal intra-agency transfer to the Oklahoma Merit
5 Protection Commission pursuant to the Oklahoma Personnel Act unless
6 transfer is in violation of Section 840-2.5 or 840-2.9 of Title 74
7 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

8 4. The Department of Public Safety shall follow the uniform
9 grievance procedure established and adopted by the Office of
10 Personnel Management for permanent classified employees, except for
11 those employees who are commissioned officers of the Department.
12 The Department of Public Safety shall establish and adopt a
13 proprietary grievance procedure for commissioned officers of the
14 Department which is otherwise in compliance with the provisions of
15 Section 840-6.2 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

16 E. 1. The Commissioner is hereby authorized to purchase and
17 issue uniforms and necessary equipment for all commissioned officers
18 of the Highway Patrol Division of the Department. All uniforms and
19 equipment shall be used only in the performance of the official
20 duties of such officers and shall remain the property of the
21 Department, except as provided in Section 2-150 of this title.

22 2. Each commissioned officer of the Highway Patrol Division of
23 the Department of Public Safety shall be entitled to reimbursement

1 of expenses pursuant to the State Travel Reimbursement Act while
2 away from the assigned area of the officer as designated by the
3 Chief of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division, when such expense is
4 incurred in the service of the state.

5 F. 1. The positions with the rank of Colonel and Lieutenant
6 Colonel of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division shall be filled from
7 the body of commissioned officers of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol
8 Division and appointment to said position shall be based on
9 qualifications, previous record as a commissioned officer of the
10 Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division, length of service, years of
11 experience within the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division or other
12 service as prescribed in this subsection, and efficiency of service
13 performed.

14 2. In addition to the requirements of paragraph 1 of this
15 subsection, the position of Chief of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol
16 Division shall be based on one of the following:

- 17 a. one (1) year of experience in any combination:
18 (1) as Commissioner of Public Safety,
19 (2) as Assistant Commissioner of Public Safety, or
20 (3) as Assistant Chief,
21 b. two (2) years of experience in any combination:
22 (1) as Deputy Chief or higher rank, or

- 1 (2) if the experience was prior to ~~the effective date~~
2 ~~of this act~~ April 21, 2006, as Major or higher
3 rank,
- 4 c. four (4) years of experience in any combination:
- 5 (1) as Major or higher rank, or
- 6 (2) if the experience was prior to ~~the effective date~~
7 ~~of this act~~ April 21, 2006, as Captain or higher
8 rank, or
- 9 d. six (6) years of experience in any combination:
- 10 (1) as Captain or higher rank, or
- 11 (2) if the experience was prior to ~~the effective date~~
12 ~~of this act~~ April 21, 2006, as First Lieutenant
13 or higher rank.

14 3. In addition to the requirements of paragraph 1 of this
15 subsection, the position of Deputy Chief of the Oklahoma Highway
16 Patrol Division shall be based on one of the following:

- 17 a. one (1) year of experience in any combination:
- 18 (1) as Commissioner of Public Safety,
- 19 (2) as Assistant Commissioner of Public Safety, or
- 20 (3) as Colonel,
- 21 b. two (2) years of experience in any combination:
- 22 (1) as Major or higher rank, or

1 (2) if the experience was prior to ~~the effective date~~
2 ~~of this act~~ April 21, 2006, as Captain or higher
3 rank, or

4 c. four (4) years of experience in any combination:

5 (1) as Captain or higher rank, or

6 (2) if the experience was prior to ~~the effective date~~
7 ~~of this act~~ April 21, 2006, as Highway Patrol
8 First Lieutenant or higher rank.

9 G. The Commissioner of Public Safety is hereby authorized to
10 send employees of the Department of Public Safety to schools such as
11 Northwestern University Center for Public Safety, Southern Police
12 Institute, the FBI National Academy, the Institute of Police
13 Technology and Management, or to any other schools of similar
14 training which would be conducive to improving the efficiency of the
15 Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division and the Department of Public
16 Safety. While an employee is attending a school, the Commissioner
17 is authorized to permit the employee to use a state-owned vehicle
18 and to use a fuel-purchasing card for any expenses related to the
19 operation of the vehicle. In addition, while an employee is
20 attending the FBI National Academy, a one-time expense allowance of
21 Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) for uniforms, fees, travel, room
22 and board, and other related expenses shall be paid to the employee
23 by the Department; provided, the employee shall not be further

1 compensated through the State Travel Reimbursement Act, and, if any
2 other agency reimburses the employee for any expenses, the
3 reimbursement shall be given to the Department. All purchases made
4 by the employee with the expense allowance shall be considered
5 property of the employee.

6 H. 1. Any former commissioned officer of the Department whose
7 separation from the Department was at such officer's own request and
8 not a result of such officer's own actions contrary to the policy of
9 the Department or was not as a result of the retirement of that
10 officer from the Department may make application for reinstatement
11 as a commissioned officer of the division or section of the
12 Department in which such officer was previously employed, provided
13 such reinstated officer will be able to complete twenty (20) years
14 of credited service by the time the reinstated officer reaches
15 sixty-two (62) years of age. The Commissioner may waive the
16 requirements of possessing the number of semester hours or degree as
17 required in subsection B of this section for any former commissioned
18 officer making application for reinstatement as a commissioned
19 officer of the Department. The Commissioner may require the
20 applicant for reinstatement to attend selected courses of
21 instruction, as prescribed by the Commissioner.

22 2. In the event of future hostilities wherein the Congress of
23 the United States declares this nation in a state of war with a

1 foreign nation, including military service brought about by the
2 Vietnam War, any period of military service served by a commissioned
3 officer of the Department shall be considered as continued service
4 with such Department, provided such commissioned officer returns to
5 duty with the Department within sixty (60) days after release from
6 military service.

7 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2001, Section 2-105.6, as
8 last amended by Section 3, Chapter 83, 2nd Extraordinary Session,
9 O.S.L. 2006 (47 O.S. Supp. 2009, Section 2-105.6), is amended to
10 read as follows:

11 Section 2-105.6. A. There is hereby created within the
12 Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety
13 a ~~Lake Patrol~~ Marine Enforcement Section which shall consist of such
14 employees as may be necessary to enforce the provisions of Section
15 4001 et seq., Section 4101 et seq., and Section 4200 et seq. of
16 Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes. All commissioned officers of the
17 ~~Lake Patrol~~ Marine Enforcement Section as designated by the
18 Commissioner shall have the authority to stop and board any vessel
19 subject to Section 4001 et seq. of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes
20 and make any necessary arrest for violations of Section 4001 et seq.
21 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes or the rules promulgated by the
22 Department of Public Safety or the Department of Wildlife
23 Conservation or take any other action within their lawful authority.

1 Any statutory references to the Oklahoma Lake Patrol Division or the
2 Lake Patrol Section of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division shall
3 mean the ~~Lake Patrol~~ Marine Enforcement Section of the Oklahoma
4 Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety.

5 B. ~~Any officer of the Lake Patrol Section of the Oklahoma~~
6 ~~Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety may~~
7 ~~request reclassification to the equivalent lateral position, rank~~
8 ~~and salary within the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division and shall be~~
9 ~~reclassified to such position if the officer:~~

10 1. ~~Meets the requirements of paragraph 2 of subsection B of~~
11 ~~Section 2-105 of this title. Provided, such officer shall be exempt~~
12 ~~from the maximum age limitation;~~

13 2. ~~Satisfactorily completes a course of training as prescribed~~
14 ~~by the Commissioner; and~~

15 3. ~~Serves a twelve-month probationary period which shall~~
16 ~~commence upon entering into the course of training required by~~
17 ~~paragraph 2 of this subsection.~~

18 C. All commissioned officers of the ~~Lake Patrol~~ Marine
19 Enforcement Section of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division of the
20 Department of Public Safety shall have, in addition to their primary
21 duty as prescribed in subsection A of this section, a secondary duty
22 to enforce all state statutes, to make arrests for violations and to
23 perform other duties as prescribed by the Commissioner.

~~D. 1. a. The annual salaries for the commissioned officers within the Lake Patrol Section of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety shall be in accordance and conformity with the following salary schedule, exclusive of longevity pay, as authorized by Section 840 2.18 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, expense allowance, as authorized by Section 2 130 of this title, and irregular shift pay, as authorized by Section 2 130.1 of this title.~~

~~b. Each Highway Patrolman shall receive upon the anniversary date of the Patrolman an annual salary increase to the next higher step of the salary schedule provided for in subparagraph a of this paragraph if the Patrolman, within the preceding twelve month period:~~

1 ~~(2) has not received any disciplinary action which~~

11 C. The annual salaries for the commissioned officers within the
12 ~~Lake Patrol~~ Marine Enforcement Section of the Oklahoma Highway
13 Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety shall be in
14 accordance and conformity with the following salary schedule,
15 exclusive of longevity pay, as authorized by Section 840-2.18 of
16 Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, expense allowance, as authorized
17 by Section 2-130 of this title, and irregular shift pay, as
18 authorized by Section 2-130.1 of this title:

22 E- D. The provisions of this section shall supersede all
23 existing laws covering the salaries for the commissioned Patrolmen

1 in the ~~Lake Patrol~~ Marine Enforcement Section of the Oklahoma
2 Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety.

3 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2001, Section 6-201, as
4 last amended by Section 5, Chapter 149, O.S.L. 2004 (47 O.S. Supp.
5 2009, Section 6-201), is amended to read as follows:

6 Section 6-201. A. The Department of Public Safety is hereby
7 authorized to cancel or deny any person's driving privilege upon
8 determining that the person:

9 1. Is not entitled to a driver license or identification card
10 issued to the person; or

11 2. Failed to give the required or correct information in the
12 application.

13 Upon such cancellation or denial, the person to whom the license or
14 card was issued shall surrender the license or card so canceled to
15 the Department. The person may apply for a valid driver license or
16 identification card, if the person is otherwise eligible. Any
17 person whose driving privilege is canceled or denied under the
18 provisions of this subsection shall have the right to an appeal as
19 provided in Section 6-211 of this title.

20 B. Upon determination by the Department that any person:

21 1. Used fraudulent information to apply for or obtain a driver
22 license or identification card;

1 2. Committed or aided another person in the commission of any
2 act provided in subparagraph b, c, e, g, or h of paragraph 1 of
3 Section 6-301 of this title; or

4 3. Committed or aided another person in the commission of any
5 act provided in subparagraph a, b, c, d, e, or f of paragraph 2 of
6 Section 6-301 of this title, the Department shall revoke the
7 person's driving privilege for a period of sixty (60) days for a
8 first determination. For a second or subsequent determination by
9 the Department under paragraph 1, 2 or 3 of this subsection, the
10 person's driving privilege shall be revoked for a period of six (6)
11 months. Such periods shall not be subject to modification. Upon
12 such revocation, the person to whom the license or card was issued
13 shall surrender the license or card to the Department. The person
14 may apply for a valid identification card, if the person is
15 otherwise eligible.

16 C. A determination, as provided for in subsection B of this
17 section, shall include:

18 1. A conviction in any court, when the conviction becomes
19 final; or

20 2. The findings of an investigation by the ~~Driver License Fraud~~
21 Identity Verification Unit of, the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division
22 of the Department, or a designee of the Commissioner of Public
23 Safety.

1 D. Any person whose driving privilege is revoked under the
2 provisions of subsection B of this section may be required to obtain
3 a release from the ~~Driver License Fraud~~ Identity Verification Unit
4 of the Department, the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division, or a
5 designee of the Commissioner of Public Safety before being
6 considered for reinstatement of driving privileges.

7 E. Any person whose driving privilege is revoked under the
8 provisions of subsection B of this section shall have the right to
9 an appeal as provided in Section 6-211 of this title.

10 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2001, Section 4205, is
11 amended to read as follows:

12 Section 4205. A. The United States Army Corps of Engineers,
13 the Oklahoma Department of Tourism and Recreation, and the Grand
14 River Dam Authority may authorize the holding of sanctioned events
15 on any waters of this state under their jurisdiction. ~~Said~~ The
16 administering entities shall promulgate rules pursuant to Article 1
17 of the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, Section 250 et seq.
18 of Title 75 of the Oklahoma Statutes, concerning the safety of other
19 vessels and persons thereon, both observers and participants. No
20 sanctioned event shall be held without a written permit from ~~said~~
21 the administering entity, and ~~said~~ such written permit shall be
22 available for inspection at all times during the event.

1 B. Whenever a sanctioned event is proposed to be held, the
2 administering entity shall, upon granting approval to hold such
3 event and at least ten (10) days prior thereto, file a notification
4 in writing of ~~said~~ the event with the ~~Lake Patrol~~ Marine Enforcement
5 Section of the Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public
6 Safety. Such notification shall set forth the date, time, location
7 where the sanctioned event is proposed to be held, the type of event
8 and the person in charge of ~~said~~ the event.

9 C. No person shall hold or give permission to hold any
10 sanctioned event in an unsafe manner or under unsafe environmental
11 conditions so as to endanger life or property. Should any duly
12 authorized peace officer of this state determine within their
13 jurisdiction that such event is being held or conducted in an unsafe
14 manner or under unsafe environmental conditions, such officer shall
15 have the authority to cancel or terminate ~~said~~ the event.

16 SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2010.
