SENATE BILL NO. 757 - By: Burrage and Johnson (Constance) of the Senate and Steele of the House.

[public health and safety - Oklahoma Health Information Security and Privacy Collaboration - codification - effective date]

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-722.1 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Oklahoma Health Information Security and Privacy Collaboration (OKHISPC) shall evaluate potential barriers to the broad adoption of standards-based electronic health information systems, including electronic health records and statewide health information exchange. These barriers may include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Broadband access;
- 2. Penetration;
- 3. Capacity;
- 4. Application program interface availability and development;

and

1 5. Health information technology (HIT) systems acquisition and
2 ongoing operational costs, including hardware, software, licensing,
3 support staff, and training expenses.

4 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2009.
