AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to the Board of Medicolegal Investigations; making an appropriation; stating purpose; requiring budgeting in certain categories and amounts; providing for the duties and compensation of employees; limiting salary of the Chief Medical Examiner; providing budgetary limitations; making certain full-time-equivalent employees contingent upon certain funding; providing lapse dates; requiring and prohibiting certain budget practices; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Board of Medicolegal Investigations from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, the sum of _____ Dollars (\$0.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to perform

1 the duties imposed upon the Board of Medicolegal Investigations by
2 law.

3 SECTION 2. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, the Board
4 of Medicolegal Investigations shall budget all funds in the
5 following categories and amounts:

13 SECTION 3. The duties and compensation of employees, not
14 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed
15 upon the Board of Medicolegal Investigations by law shall be set by
16 the Board. The salary of the Chief Medical Examiner shall not
17 exceed _____ Dollars (\$0.00) per annum, payable monthly for
18 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010. The Board of Medicolegal
19 Investigations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, shall be
20 subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-
21 equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for
22 capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant
23 to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma
24 Statutes:

4 SECTION 4. Of the total number of full-time-equivalent
5 employees authorized for the Board of Medicolegal Investigations,
6 one shall be employed contingent upon sufficient federal grant
7 funding to support them.

8 SECTION 5. Appropriations made by this act, not including
9 appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for
10 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010 (hereafter FY-10) or may be
11 budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011 (hereafter FY-11).
12 Funds budgeted for FY-10 may be encumbered only through June 30,
13 2010, and must be expended by November 15, 2010. Any funds
14 remaining after November 15, 2010, and not budgeted for FY-11, shall
15 lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal
16 year. Funds budgeted for FY-11 may be encumbered only through June
17 30, 2011. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2011, shall lapse
18 to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year.
19 These appropriations may not be budgeted in both fiscal years
20 simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-10, and not required to pay
21 obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-11, after
22 the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared
23 and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds

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1 from the FY-10 budget work program and after such revision has been
2 approved by the Office of State Finance.

3 SECTION 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 2009.

4 SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
5 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
6 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
7 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
