8 AS INTRODUCED

9  
10 An Act relating to the Supreme Court; making  
11 appropriations; stating purposes; requiring budgeting  
12 in certain categories and amounts; providing for  
13 duties and compensation of employees of the Supreme  
14 Court and the Court of Civil Appeals; providing  
15 budgetary limitations; providing lapse dates;  
16 requiring and prohibiting certain budget procedures;  
17 providing an effective date; and declaring an  
18 emergency.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

20 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Supreme Court  
21 from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue  
22 Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010,  
23 the sum of \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$0.00) or so much thereof as may  
24 be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Supreme Court or  
the Court of Civil Appeals by law:

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated to the Supreme Court  
from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue

1 Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010,  
2 the sum of \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$0.00) to transfer to the  
3 Legal Services Revolving Fund created pursuant to subsection G of  
4 Section 921.1 of Title 12 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

5 SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated to the Supreme Court  
6 for deposit in the Supreme Court Revolving Fund from any monies not  
7 otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State  
8 Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, the sum of  
9 \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$0.00) for expenditures authorized by  
10 Section 1310.1 of Title 20 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

11 SECTION 4. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, the  
12 Supreme Court shall budget all funds in the following categories and  
13 amounts:

19 SECTION 5. The duties and compensation of employees, not  
20 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed  
21 upon the Supreme Court by law shall be set by the Supreme Court  
22 Justices by majority vote.

23 SECTION 6. The duties and compensation of employees, not  
24 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed

1 upon the Court of Civil Appeals by law shall be set by the Court of  
2 Civil Appeals, subject to the approval of the Supreme Court.

3 SECTION 7. The Supreme Court and the Court of Civil Appeals for  
4 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, shall be subject to the  
5 following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees,  
6 excluding active retired judges, and expenditures, excluding  
7 expenditures for capital and special projects and excluding lawful  
8 expenditures from the State Judicial Fund, except as may be  
9 authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of  
10 the Oklahoma Statutes:

14 SECTION 8. Appropriations made by this act, not including  
15 appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for  
16 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010 (hereafter FY-10) or may be  
17 budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011 (hereafter FY-11).  
18 Any remaining cash balance on November 15, 2010, may be transferred  
19 to the Supreme Court Administrative Revolving Fund as needed.

20 SECTION 9. Of the monies appropriated to the Supreme Court by  
21 Sections 113, 114 and 115 of Enrolled House Bill No. 2276 of the 2nd  
22 Session of the 51st Oklahoma Legislature, not including  
23 appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, any remaining cash  
24

1 balance on November 15, 2009, may be transferred to the Supreme  
2 Court Administrative Revolving Fund as needed.

3 SECTION 10. This act shall become effective July 1, 2009.

4 SECTION 11. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
5 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby  
6 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
7 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
