9 AS INTRODUCED

10 An Act relating to the Scenic Rivers Commission;
11 making an appropriation; stating purpose; providing
12 for duties and compensation of employees; limiting
13 salary of the Director; providing budgetary
14 limitations; providing lapse dates; requiring certain
15 budget procedures; prohibiting certain budget
16 procedures; providing an effective date; and
17 declaring an emergency.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Scenic Rivers
20 Commission from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the
21 General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year
22 ending June 30, 2010, the sum of _____ Dollars
23 (\$0.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to perform the duties
24 imposed upon the Scenic Rivers Commission by law.

1 SECTION 2. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, the Scenic
2 Rivers Commission shall budget all funds in the following categories
3 and amounts:

6 SECTION 3. The duties and compensation of employees, not
7 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed
8 upon the Scenic Rivers Commission by law shall be set by the
9 Administrator of the Scenic Rivers Commission. The salary of the
10 Administrator of the Scenic Rivers Commission shall not exceed
11 _____ Dollars (\$0.00) per annum, payable monthly for the
12 fiscal year ending June 30, 2010. The Scenic Rivers Commission, for
13 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, shall be subject to the
14 following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees
15 and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special
16 projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of
17 Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

21 SECTION 4. Appropriations made by this act, not including
22 appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for
23 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010 (hereafter FY-10) or may be
24 budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011 (hereafter FY-11).

1 Funds budgeted for FY-10 may be encumbered only through June 30,
2 2010, and must be expended by November 15, 2010. Any funds
3 remaining after November 15, 2010, and not budgeted for FY-11, shall
4 lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal
5 year. Funds budgeted for FY-11 may be encumbered only through June
6 30, 2011. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2011, shall lapse
7 to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year.
8 These appropriations may not be budgeted in both fiscal years
9 simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-10, and not required to pay
10 obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-11, after
11 the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared
12 and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds
13 from the FY-10 budget work program and after such revision has been
14 approved by the Office of State Finance.

15 SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2009.

16 SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
17 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
18 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
19 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
