6	<u>AS INTRODUCED</u>
7	An Act relating to amusements and sports; amending 3A O.S. 2001, Sections 602, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 329, O.S.L. 2008, 606, as last amended by
8	Section 7, Chapter 329, O.S.L. 2008 and 616, as last amended by Section 16, Chapter 329, O.S.L. 2008 (3A
9	O.S. Supp. 2008, Sections 602, 606 and 616), which relate to the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission;
10	modifying and adding definitions; expanding jurisdiction to include certain mixed martial arts
11	contests; increasing limit on certain fund; and declaring an emergency.
12	
13	
14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 3A O.S. 2001, Section 602, as
16	amended by Section 2, Chapter 329, O.S.L. 2008 (3A O.S. Supp. 2008,
17	Section 602), is amended to read as follows:
18	Section 602. A. As used in the Oklahoma State Athletic
19	Commission Act:
20	1. "Administrator" means the administrator of the Oklahoma
21	State Athletic Commission;
22	2. "Amateur boxer" means a person who has never received or
23	competed for any purse or other article either for the expenses of
24	training therefor or for participating in any boxing contest or

1 professional exhibition which exceeds in monies or other things of 2 value a sum to be determined by the Oklahoma State Athletic 3 Commission;

3. <u>"Amateur mixed martial artist" means a person eighteen (18)</u>
years of age or older who has never received or competed for any
purse or other article either for the expenses of training therefor
or for participating in any combative sport contest or professional
exhibition which exceeds in monies or other things of value a sum to
be determined by the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission;

<u>4. "Amateur mixed martial arts" means any form of competitive</u>
pugilistic contest in which the participants have never been
<u>licensed as professionals in any combative sport and blows are</u>
<u>delivered with any part of the hands, feet, or knees and multiple</u>
<u>combative disciplines are used including grappling. Such contests</u>
<u>take place in a rope-enclosed ring or fenced enclosed cage and are</u>
fought in timed rounds;

17 <u>5.</u> "Applicant" means any individual, club, association,
18 corporation, partnership or trust which submits to the Oklahoma
19 State Athletic Commission an application for a license or permit
20 pursuant to the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act;

4. <u>6.</u> "Booking agent" means independent contractors who act as
bookers, agents, agencies and representatives who secure engagements
and contracts for boxers combative sports participants;

1 5. 7. "Boxing" means any form of competitive pugilism or
2 unarmed combat in which a blow is usually struck which may
3 reasonably be expected to inflict injury, including, but not limited
4 to, boxing, wrestling, <u>mixed martial arts</u>, and kickboxing, but shall
5 not include the martial arts as defined by the provisions of this
6 section;

"Broadcast" means any audio or visual transmission sent 7 6. 8. by any means of signal within, into, or from this state, whether 8 9 live or taped or time delayed, and includes any replays thereof; 10 7. 9. "Cable system operator" means any person who makes available or provides customers a closed-circuit telecast which is 11 pay-per-view, including any person who does so as a direct broadcast 12 satellite provider or other multichannel video service provider; 13 8. 10. "Closed-circuit telecast of professional boxing 14 combative sporting events" means telecast rights, including 15 television, cable television, or pay-per-view telecasts, acquired by 16 paying a licensing fee or by paying a contractual price by a 17 business or individual, including, but not limited to, arenas, 18 entertainment or meeting centers, restaurants, bars, taverns, 19 hotels, motels, clubs, and organizations, which offers the viewing 20 of the event to the public or to private residences. Such events 21 shall include local and state professional boxing contests and 22 professional exhibitions as defined in this section. For purposes 23 of Sections 621 and Section 622 of this title, "closed-circuit 24

telecast" means any such telecast of a professional boxing combative sporting event as described herein which is not intended to be available for viewing without the payment of a fee, collected for or based upon each event viewed, for the privilege of viewing the telecast, and includes pay-per-view;

9. <u>11.</u> "Club" means an incorporated or unincorporated
association or body of individuals voluntarily united and acting
together for some common or special purpose;

9 10. 12. "Combative sports" means any form of competitive
10 pugilism or unarmed combat in which a blow is usually struck which
11 may reasonably be expected to inflict injury, including but not
12 limited to boxing, wrestling, mixed martial arts, and kickboxing,
13 but shall not include the martial arts (singular) as defined by the
14 provisions of this section;

15 <u>13.</u> "Commission" means the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission; 16 <u>11.</u> <u>14.</u> "Contest" means a boxing <u>combative sports</u> match in 17 which it is reasonable to anticipate that the participants strive 18 earnestly in good faith to win;

19 <u>12.</u> <u>15.</u> "Corner person" means, but shall not be limited to, a 20 trainer, a second, or any other individual who attends the 21 participant during a match;

22 13. 16. "Exhibition" means a boxing match in which the 23 participants show or display their skill without necessarily 24 striving to win, such as sparring;

1 14. 17. "Judge" means an individual other than a referee who
 2 shall have a vote in determining the winner of any contest;

3 15. 18. "Kickboxing" means any form of competitive pugilistic 4 professional contest in which blows are delivered with the hand and 5 any part of the foot. Such contests take place in a rope-enclosed 6 ring and are fought in timed rounds;

7 16. 19. "License" means a certificate issued by the Commission 8 to participants of sanctioned professional boxing combative sports 9 contests and, professional exhibitions, and amateur mixed martial 10 arts contests and is a mandatory requirement for participation in 11 such events;

12 17. 20. "Manager" means an individual who controls or 13 administers the affairs of any professional boxer combative sports 14 participant, including acting as a booking agent. "Manager" shall 15 include the representative of a manager as defined by the 16 Commission;

17 18. <u>21.</u> "Martial arts" means any form of karate, kung fu, tae 18 kwon-do, or any other form of martial or self-defense art; 19 <u>19. 22.</u> "Matchmaker" means an individual who brings together 20 professional boxers <u>combative sports participants</u> or arranges 21 professional boxing <u>combative sports</u> contests or professional 22 exhibitions;

20. 23. "Participant" means a professional <u>an individual</u> who
 takes part in a professional boxing <u>combative sports</u> contest, an
 amateur mixed martial arts contest, or professional exhibition;

21. 24. "Pay-per-view telecasts of professional boxing events"
means telecasts offered by cable television companies to subscribers
at a cost in addition to the monthly cable television subscription
rate. Such events shall include local and state professional boxing
contests and professional exhibitions as defined in this section;
22. 25. "Person" means any individual, partnership, limited

9 <u>22.</u> <u>25.</u> "Person" means any individual, partnership, limited 10 liability company, club, association, corporation, or trust;

11 23. 26. "Physician" means an individual licensed under the laws 12 of this state to engage in the general practice of medicine or 13 osteopathic medicine;

14 24. 27. "Professional boxer" means an individual eighteen (18) 15 years of age or older who competes for money, prizes, or purses, or 16 who teaches, instructs, or assists in the practice of boxing or 17 sparring as a means of obtaining pecuniary gain;

18 25. 28. "Professional boxing contest, amateur mixed martial arts contest, and professional exhibition" means mean a boxing combative sports match conducted within this state in which the participants are persons who must be licensed pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act; 26. 29. "Professional mixed martial arts" means any form of competitive pugilistic contest in which the participants are paid a

purse and blows are delivered with any part of the hands, feet,
elbows, or knees and multiple combative disciplines are used to
include grappling. Such contests take place in a rope-enclosed ring
or fenced enclosed cage and are fought in timed rounds;

<u>30</u>. "Promoter" means any individual, whether a resident or
nonresident of Oklahoma, or club or corporation, whether
domesticated or not domesticated in Oklahoma, that produces or
stages professional contests, amateur mixed martial arts contests,
or professional exhibitions conducted within this state and shall
include any officer, director, or employees as defined by the
Commission;

12 27. <u>31.</u> "Pugilism" means boxing <u>combative sports</u> or the skill
13 or practice of fighting with the fists;

28. 32. "Purse" means the financial guarantee or any other 14 remuneration or thing of value for which a professional boxer 15 participates in a professional boxing contest or professional 16 exhibition and shall include the participant's share of any payment 17 received for radio broadcasting, television, including cable 18 television, pay-per-view television, and closed-circuit television, 19 and motion picture rights. "Purse" shall also include gate receipts 20 and any other prizes; 21

22 29. 33. "Ring official" means any individual who performs an 23 official function during the progress of a professional boxing 24 contest, amateur mixed martial arts contest, or professional

exhibition including but not limited to timekeepers, judges,
 referees, and attending physicians;

3 30. 34. "Sanctioning permit" means a permit issued by the
4 Commission to promoters who make application for official approval
5 of professional boxing contests, amateur mixed martial arts contests
6 and professional exhibitions;

31. 35. "Sparring" means to engage in a form of boxing with
jabbing or feinting movements, and the exchange of few heavy blows,
such as occurs in a practice or exhibition boxing match;

10 32. 36. "Telecast promoter", for purposes of Sections 621 and 11 Section 622 of this title, means any promoter who shows or causes to 12 be shown in this state a closed-circuit telecast of any professional 13 boxing event, whether or not the telecast or event originates in 14 this state. "Telecast promoter" shall not include a cable system 15 operator;

33. <u>37.</u> "Trainer" means an individual who assists, coaches, or
instructs any professional boxer <u>or amateur mixed martial arts</u>
<u>participant</u> with respect to physical conditioning, strategy,
techniques, or preparation for competition, professional boxing
contests, or professional exhibitions; and

21 34. 38. "Vendor" means any individual, firm, organization,
22 club, or corporation that participates in the conduct of a
23 professional boxing contest, amateur mixed martial arts contest, or
24 professional exhibition by offering for sale food or merchandise,

including, but not limited to, wearing apparel, alcoholic and
 nonalcoholic beverages, souvenirs, and programs.

B. The Commission may define any term which is not defined in4 the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act.

5 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 3A O.S. 2001, Section 606, as last 6 amended by Section 7, Chapter 329, O.S.L. 2008 (3A O.S. Supp. 2008, 7 Section 606), is amended to read as follows:

8 Section 606. A. The Oklahoma State Athletic Commission is 9 hereby vested with jurisdiction to issue sanctioning permits for all 10 professional boxing contests, amateur mixed martial arts contests, 11 and professional exhibitions held or given within this state and 12 licenses for participants of sanctioned contests and exhibitions.

B. Specifically exempt from the provisions of the Oklahoma
State Athletic Commission Act are the contests or exhibitions
conducted or sponsored by:

Any school, college, or university where the participants
 are students regularly enrolled in such institutions and the
 instructors, coaches, and trainers are employees of such
 institutions. The term "school, college, or university" shall not
 include a school or other institution whose principal purpose is to
 furnish instruction in boxing or sparring;

22 2. Any military installation or branch of the Armed Forces23 where the participants are employed by the military installation or

are members of the branch of the Armed Forces sponsoring the contest
 or exhibition; and

Amateur boxing matches which are sanctioned by a Commission-3 3. approved and nationally recognized amateur sanctioning body. 4 То 5 obtain an exemption from the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act under this paragraph, a nationally recognized amateur sanctioning 6 body must present itself to the Commission and provide a copy of its 7 rules and bylaws for Commission review and approval. Upon approval, 8 9 the Commission, or its designated representatives, may visit, attend, investigate and audit, as the Commission deems necessary, 10 any match, event, sanctioning body office or event office for the 11 12 purpose of determining whether the rules and bylaws of the amateur 13 sanctioning body as submitted to the Commission are being followed. The Commission administrator shall immediately rescind approval of 14 any nationally recognized amateur sanctioning body, pending a 15 hearing, if said sanctioning body is found to be negligent or 16 17 noncommittal in the enforcement of the rules and bylaws presented to and approved by the Commission. 18

C. The following persons are specifically exempt from theprovisions of the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act:

Practitioners and instructors of the martial arts as defined
 in Section 602 of this title; and

2. Instructors of amateur boxers if such instructors are not
 required to be licensed pursuant to other provisions of the Oklahoma
 3 State Athletic Commission Act.

4 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 3A O.S. 2001, Section 616, as last 5 amended by Section 16, Chapter 329, O.S.L. 2008 (3A O.S. Supp. 2008, 6 Section 616), is amended to read as follows:

Section 616. A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury 7 a revolving fund for the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission to be 8 9 designated the "Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year 10 limitations, and shall consist of all monies received from fees, 11 administrative fines, reimbursements, bond proceeds, and sale of 12 13 materials, and shall include grants and gifts, pursuant to the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act. All monies accruing to the 14 credit of said fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and 15 expended by the State Department of Health as directed by the 16 17 Commission for the purpose of implementing the provisions of the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act; provided, revenue in excess 18 of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) Seven Hundred 19 Thousand Dollars (\$700,000.00) during any fiscal year shall be 20 deposited to the credit of the General Revenue Fund of the State 21 Treasury. Expenditures from said fund shall be made upon warrants 22 issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by 23 law with the Director of State Finance for approval and payment. 24

1	B. The "Professional Boxing Licensing Revolving Fund" created
2	for the Department of Health is hereby abolished. On July 1, 2008,
3	any unencumbered funds remaining in the Professional Boxing
4	Licensing Revolving Fund shall be transferred to the credit of the
5	Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Revolving Fund. Any unexpended
6	funds remaining in the Professional Boxing Licensing Revolving Fund
7	after November 1, 2008, shall be transferred to the credit of the
8	Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Revolving Fund.
9	SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
10	of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
11	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
12	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
