5 AS INTRODUCED

6 An Act relating to crimes and punishments; making
7 certain acts unlawful; providing penalties; providing
8 for codification; and providing an effective date.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

11 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
12 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 540C of Title 21, unless there
13 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

14 A. It shall be unlawful for any person to use, construct,
15 position, or hold any device used to fortify any door or window of
16 any store, shop warehouse, dwelling house or building, or any place
17 whatever which is being used during the attempt or commission of a
18 crime, for the purpose of preventing entry, delaying or injuring law
19 enforcement.

20 B. Any person who violates this section when committing,
21 attempting to commit, or aiding another person to commit or attempt
22 to commit any misdemeanor shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a
23 misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment in the county jail for not
24

1 more than one (1) year, or a fine of not more than Five Thousand
2 Dollars (\$5,000.00), or by both such imprisonment and fine.

3 C. Any person who violates this section when committing,
4 attempting to commit, or aiding another person to commit or attempt
5 to commit any felony shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a felony
6 punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of
7 Corrections for not more than five (5) years, or a fine of not more
8 than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), or by both such imprisonment
9 and fine.

10 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2009.
