6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to soldiers and sailors; amending 72
8 O.S. 2001, Section 1, which relates to certain
9 affidavit requirements regarding record and financial
10 need of disabled ex-service persons; clarifying
11 language; and providing an effective date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 72 O.S. 2001, Section 1, is
14 amended to read as follows:

15 Section 1. It shall be lawful for any needy disabled ex-service
16 person, who has been a citizen and resident of this state for one
17 (1) year, to engage in what is commonly known as hawking and
18 peddling, to give illustrated lectures, magic lantern exhibitions
19 and such other like entertainments without either state, county,
20 city or town license or tax for the privilege of so doing. Before
21 any ex-service person shall be entitled to any of the privileges set
22 out in this act, ~~he shall make~~ an affidavit shall be made in writing
23 before some officer authorized by law to administer oaths, that ~~he~~
24 the ex-service person is a citizen and resident of this state, and

1 has been for one (1) year previous and that ~~he~~ the ex-service person
2 served in the military or naval forces of the United States or of
3 the Confederate States of America, and was honorably discharged
4 therefrom, and ~~that he~~ is in genuine financial need of the
5 privileges conferred by this act. A certificate of the judge of the
6 district court in which any ex-service person has complied with the
7 provisions of this act, and ~~that he~~ is entitled to the benefits and
8 privileges set out above, shall be sufficient proof of the need or
9 disability of said ex-service person, and of said ex-service
10 person's service in the military or naval forces of the United
11 States or of the Confederate States of America. Such certificate
12 shall be of public record in the office of the county clerk in the
13 county courthouse of the county where it is issued, or shall be of
14 record in the office of the city clerk in the city where the
15 privilege conferred herein is to be exercised, and shall also be of
16 record in the police station of any such city. No single
17 certificate shall be effective for a period in excess of sixty (60)
18 days, and all such certificates heretofore issued shall become null
19 and void sixty (60) days after the effective date of this act.

20 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2009.
