9 AS INTRODUCED

10 An Act relating to the Corporation Commission; making
11 an appropriation; stating purpose; requiring
12 budgeting in certain categories and amounts;
13 providing for duties and compensation of employees;
14 limiting salary of the General Administrator;
15 providing budgetary limitations; providing lapse
16 dates; providing an effective date; and declaring an
17 emergency.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Corporation
20 Commission from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the
21 General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year
22 ending June 30, 2011, the sum of _____ Dollars (\$0.00) or so
23 much thereof as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon
24 the Corporation Commission by law.

1 SECTION 2. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, the
 2 Corporation Commission shall budget all funds in the following
 3 categories and amounts:

16 SECTION 3. The duties and compensation of employees, not
 17 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed
 18 upon the Corporation Commission by law shall be set by the General
 19 Administrator. The salary of the General Administrator of the
 20 Corporation Commission shall not exceed _____ Dollars (\$0.00)
 21 per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011.
 22 The Corporation Commission shall be subject to the following
 23 budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and
 24 expenditures excluding direct expenditures for well plugging as

1 authorized in Section 310 of Title 52 of the Oklahoma Statutes, pit
2 closure as authorized in Section 140 of Title 52 of the Oklahoma
3 Statutes, and remediation of sites as authorized in Section 353 of
4 Title 17 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and as may be authorized pursuant
5 to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma
6 Statutes:

10 SECTION 4. Appropriations made by this act, not including
11 appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for
12 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011 (hereafter FY-11) or may be
13 budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012 (hereafter FY-12).
14 Funds budgeted for FY-11 may be encumbered only through June 30,
15 2011, and must be expended by November 15, 2011. Any funds
16 remaining after November 15, 2011, and not budgeted for FY-12, shall
17 lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal
18 year. Funds budgeted for FY-12 may be encumbered only through June
19 30, 2012. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2012, shall lapse
20 to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year.
21 These appropriations may not be budgeted in both fiscal years
22 simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-11, and not required to pay
23 obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-12, after
24 the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared

1 and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds
2 from the FY-11 budget work program and after such revision has been
3 approved by the Office of State Finance.

4 SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2010.

5 SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
6 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
7 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
8 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
