6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to firearms; creating the Government
8 Employee Protection Act of 2010; authorizing certain
9 municipal employees to carry firearms under certain
10 circumstances; amending 19 O.S. 2001, Section 215.29,
11 which relates to the carrying of firearms by district
12 attorneys; authorizing assistant district attorneys
13 to carry firearms under certain circumstances;
14 authorizing the Chief Medical Examiner and medical
15 examiners to carry firearms under certain
16 circumstances; providing for noncodification;
17 providing for codification; and providing an
18 effective date.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

20 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
21 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

22 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Government
23 Employee Protection Act of 2010".

24 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 14-111.2 of Title 11, unless
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 Employees of a municipality employed or otherwise assigned to
2 enforce municipal ordinances may carry a firearm on his or her
3 person anywhere in the state to use only for personal protection if
4 the person has successfully completed an approved course of firearm
5 training conducted by a state certified firearms instructor which
6 meets the minimum requirements for firearms training as set forth by
7 the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training.

8 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2001, Section 215.29, is
9 amended to read as follows:

10 Section 215.29 A district attorney or assistant district
11 attorney may carry a firearm on his or her person anywhere in the
12 state to use only for personal protection if ~~he~~ the person has
13 successfully completed an approved course of firearm training
14 conducted by a state certified firearms instructor which meets the
15 minimum requirements for firearms training as set forth by the
16 Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training.

17 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 956 of Title 63, unless there is
19 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20 The Chief Medical Examiner, medical examiners and medical
21 examiner investigators may carry a firearm on his or her person
22 anywhere in the state to use only for personal protection if the
23 person has successfully completed an approved course of firearm
24 training conducted by a state certified firearms instructor which

1 meets the minimum requirements for firearms training as set forth by
2 the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training.

3 SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2010.
