6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to higher education; amending 70 O.S.
8 2001, Sections 2602, as last amended by Section 1,
Chapter 437, O.S.L. 2009, 2603, as last amended by
9 Section 32, Chapter 2, O.S.L. 2009, 2604, as last
10 amended by Section 2, Chapter 437, O.S.L. 2009, and
2605, as last amended by Section 3, Chapter 437,
11 O.S.L. 2009 (70 O.S. Supp. 2009, Sections 2602, 2603,
2604 and 2605), which relate to the Oklahoma Higher
Learning Access Act; stating additional purpose of
12 the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program;
requiring students to meet certain residency and work
13 requirements to retain eligibility; making provisions
apply to certain students; requiring students who do
14 not meet certain residency and work requirements to
repay certain amount of the scholarship; providing
15 for interest on the repayment amount; providing for
deposit of repayment amount in certain fund;
16 directing the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
Education to establish certain documentation
17 requirements; adding certain residency and work
requirement to the program agreement; updating
18 statutory references; providing an effective date;
and declaring an emergency.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

22 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2001, Section 2602, as
23 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 437, O.S.L. 2009 (70 O.S. Supp.
24 2009, Section 2602), is amended to read as follows:

1 Section 2602. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Higher
2 Learning Access Program. The program shall also be known as
3 "Oklahoma's Promise". The purpose of the program is to provide an
4 award to students who meet the criteria set forth in the Oklahoma
5 Higher Learning Access Act, Section 2601 et seq. of this title, and
6 who are pursuing studies in this state leading to an associate or
7 baccalaureate degree or who are pursuing studies in a postsecondary
8 vocational-technical program or course offered pursuant to a duly
9 approved cooperative agreement between a technology center school
10 and an institution of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education,
11 and who are in good academic standing in the institution of higher
12 education or technology center school in which enrolled, to relieve
13 them of the burden of paying nonguaranteed resident tuition at
14 institutions of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, to
15 relieve them of the burden of paying tuition for enrollment in
16 postsecondary programs of the technology center districts, or to
17 relieve them of some portion of the burden of paying such fees or
18 tuition, pursuant to the provisions of this act, as may be required
19 of enrollees at private institutions of higher education which are
20 accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of this title. In addition, the
21 purpose of the program is to create incentives for students to
22 remain and work in the state after graduation. The further purpose
23 of this program is to establish and maintain a variety of support
24 services whereby a broader range of the general student population

1 of this state will be prepared for success in postsecondary
2 endeavors.

3 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2001, Section 2603, as
4 last amended by Section 32, Chapter 2, O.S.L. 2009 (70 O.S. Supp.
5 2009, Section 2603), is amended to read as follows:

6 Section 2603. A. Except as otherwise provided for in this
7 section, to be eligible to participate in the Oklahoma Higher
8 Learning Access Program and to qualify for an award which includes
9 payment of an amount equivalent to resident tuition or other tuition
10 pursuant to Section 2604 of this title for the first semester or
11 other academic unit of postsecondary enrollment, a student shall:

12 1. Be a resident of this state or be enrolled in a school
13 district located in this state that serves students who reside in
14 both this state and an adjacent state pursuant to a contract as
15 authorized in Section 5-117.1 of this title;

16 2. Be a United States citizen or lawfully present in the United
17 States. A student who is not a United States citizen or lawfully
18 present in the United States shall not be eligible to participate in
19 the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program and to qualify for an
20 award notwithstanding the provisions of Section 3242 of this title.
21 The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any student who
22 was enrolled in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program prior to
23 the end of the 2006-2007 school year;

24

1 3. Have a record of satisfactory compliance with agreements
2 executed pursuant to Section 2605 of this title;

3 4. a. have graduated within the previous three (3) years
4 from a high school accredited by the State Board of
5 Education, or the Oklahoma School of Science and
6 Mathematics with a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point
7 average on a 4.0 scale for all work attempted in
8 grades nine through twelve,

9 b. have graduated within the previous three (3) years
10 from a high school not accredited by the State Board
11 of Education with a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point
12 average on a 4.0 scale for all work attempted in
13 grades nine through twelve and have achieved a
14 composite score of 22 or higher on the ACT test, or

15 c. have satisfactorily completed within the previous
16 three (3) years an educational program that was
17 provided through a means other than a public or
18 private school and have achieved a composite score of
19 22 or higher on the ACT test;

20 5. Have completed the curricular requirements for admission to
21 an institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education
22 and one additional unit or set of competencies in a course that
23 meets college admission requirements. The curriculum requirements
24 shall include two units or sets of competencies in foreign or non-

1 English language or technology courses that meet the college
2 admission requirements and one unit or set of competencies of a fine
3 arts course. Students shall also have attained a 2.5 grade point
4 average in the core curriculum courses. Students who attended a
5 high school which did not offer all the core curriculum courses or
6 students who were educated by other means and were not offered all
7 the core curriculum courses shall be allowed to satisfy this
8 curriculum requirement by participating in a program approved by the
9 State Regents for remediation of high school curricular
10 deficiencies;

11 6. Have satisfied admission standards as determined by the
12 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for first-time-entering
13 students for the appropriate type of institution, or, if attending a
14 private institution, have satisfied admission standards as
15 determined by the private institution. No student participating in
16 the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program shall be admitted into
17 an institution of higher education by special admission standards;

18 7. Have secured admission to, and enrolled in, an institution
19 which is a member of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education,
20 a postsecondary vocational-technical program offered pursuant to a
21 duly approved cooperative agreement between a technology center
22 school and an institution of The Oklahoma State System of Higher
23 Education, or a private institution of higher learning located
24

1 within this state and accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of this
2 title; and

3 8. a. have established financial need according to the
4 provisions of subsection D of Section 2605 of this
5 title and standards and provisions promulgated by the
6 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education,

7 b. if the student was adopted between birth and twelve
8 (12) years of age while in the permanent custody of
9 the Department of Human Services, in the court-ordered
10 custody of a licensed private nonprofit child-placing
11 agency, or federally recognized Indian tribe, as
12 defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare Act, have
13 established financial need according to the provisions
14 of paragraph 1 of subsection E of Section 2605 of this
15 title and standards and provisions promulgated by the
16 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, or

17 c. if the student was adopted between thirteen (13) and
18 seventeen (17) years of age while in the permanent
19 custody of the Department of Human Services, in the
20 court-ordered custody of a licensed private nonprofit
21 child-placing agency, or federally recognized Indian
22 tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare
23 Act, have established financial need according to the
24 provisions of paragraph 2 of subsection E of Section

1 2605 of this title and standards and provisions
2 promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
3 Education.

4 B. To retain eligibility while pursuing the program of higher
5 learning in which enrolled, the student shall:

6 1. Achieve a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a
7 4.0 scale or its equivalent for courses taken through the student's
8 sophomore year and achieve a minimum grade point average of 2.5 on a
9 4.0 scale or its equivalent for courses taken during the student's
10 junior year and thereafter. The provisions of this paragraph shall
11 not apply to any student who has received an Oklahoma Higher
12 Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 2010-2011 school
13 year;

14 2. Maintain good academic standing and satisfactory academic
15 progress according to standards of the Oklahoma State Regents for
16 Higher Education;

17 3. Comply with the standards related to maintenance of
18 eligibility as promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
19 Education; and

20 4. Refrain from conduct that leads to expulsion or suspension
21 of more than one semester from an institution of higher education.
22 A student who violates the provisions of this paragraph shall
23 permanently lose eligibility for program benefits. The provisions
24 of this paragraph shall become effective January 1, 2008.

1 C. 1. To retain eligibility upon graduation from the program
2 of higher learning in which the student is enrolled, the student
3 shall:

4 a. remain a resident of the state for not less than five
5 (5) consecutive years after the year of graduation,
6 and

7 b. have an income or receipts earned from employment in
8 the state in an amount sufficient to require filing of
9 an Oklahoma income tax return for not less than five
10 (5) consecutive years after the year of graduation.

11 2. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to any
12 student who was enrolled in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access
13 Program prior to the end of the 2010-2011 school year.

14 D. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the
15 State Board of Career and Technology Education shall promulgate
16 rules relating to maintenance of eligibility under this act by a
17 student.

18 ~~D.~~ E. It is the intent of the Legislature that students in the
19 ninth grade for the 1992-93 school year who are determined to be
20 eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access students pursuant to this
21 act shall be the first students eligible for benefits from the
22 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund.

23 ~~E.~~ F. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education are
24 authorized to study, develop and propose criteria for determining

1 award eligibility based upon the completion of seven (7) semesters
2 of high school coursework by a student.

3 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2001, Section 2604, as
4 last amended by Section 2, Chapter 437, O.S.L. 2009 (70 O.S. Supp.
5 2009, Section 2604), is amended to read as follows:

6 Section 2604. A. Subject to the availability of funds, an
7 amount equivalent to the nonguaranteed resident tuition for which an
8 eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program student is
9 obligated at an institution of The Oklahoma State System of Higher
10 Education shall be awarded by allocation from the Oklahoma Higher
11 Learning Access Trust Fund.

12 B. Subject to the availability of funds, for each eligible
13 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program student enrolled at a
14 private institution of higher learning located within this state and
15 accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of this title, the Oklahoma
16 State Regents for Higher Education shall award from the Oklahoma
17 Higher Learning Access Trust Fund an amount equivalent to the amount
18 of resident tuition for which the student would be eligible if the
19 student were enrolled in a comparable program at a comparable
20 institution of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education.
21 Comparability shall be determined by the State Regents.

22 C. Subject to the availability of funds, an amount equivalent
23 to the tuition for any eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access
24 Program student enrolled in a public postsecondary vocational-

1 technical program or course for the purpose set forth in Section
2 2602 of this title shall be awarded by allocation from the Oklahoma
3 Higher Learning Access Trust Fund. Provided, such allocation shall
4 not exceed the amount a student would have received for comparable
5 enrollment at a two-year institution within The Oklahoma State
6 System of Higher Education.

7 D. 1. An award allowed by this section shall not be allowed
8 for courses or other postsecondary units taken in excess of the
9 requirements for completion of a baccalaureate program or taken more
10 than five (5) years after the student's first semester of
11 postsecondary enrollment. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
12 Education may award the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program
13 benefits for courses of postsecondary units taken more than five (5)
14 years after the student's first semester of postsecondary enrollment
15 only in hardship circumstances; ~~provided, however, no.~~ No Oklahoma
16 Higher Learning Access Program participant may receive benefits
17 beyond a cumulative time period of five (5) years.

18 2. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may award
19 the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefits for a student's
20 first semester or other academic unit of postsecondary enrollment
21 taken more than three (3) years after the student graduates from
22 high school or completes an educational program equivalent to high
23 school graduation as authorized in Section 2603 of this title if the
24 student is a member of the Armed Forces of the United States, the

1 Reserve Corps of the Armed Forces of the United States, or the
2 Oklahoma National Guard, and is ordered to active duty or active
3 duty for special work or training and due to the duty commitment the
4 student is unable to enroll prior to the end of the three-year
5 period. Such three-year period shall be extended by the length of
6 the term of duty.

7 3. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may
8 establish a maximum limit on the number of courses or other
9 postsecondary units to which Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program
10 benefits will apply.

11 4. An award for eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access
12 Program students enrolled in cooperative programs pursuant to
13 agreements between technology center schools and institutions of The
14 Oklahoma State System of Higher Education shall be satisfied for
15 both vocational-technical and college work in which enrolled
16 pursuant to such cooperative program.

17 E. Benefits awarded under the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access
18 Program shall be awarded to all eligible applicants without any
19 limitation on the number of awards in any year other than the amount
20 of funds available for the program and the number of eligible
21 applicants. Subject to the provisions of subsection F of this
22 section, if funds are not sufficient to provide awards for all
23 eligible applicants, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education
24 shall make awards on the basis of need. Provided, the Oklahoma

1 State Regents for Higher Education shall take into consideration
2 other grants and scholarships received by an eligible applicant when
3 making awards.

4 F. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may, at the
5 time an award is made on behalf of an Oklahoma Higher Learning
6 Access Program student, set aside in the Oklahoma Higher Learning
7 Access Trust Fund funds for the full commitment made to such Higher
8 Learning Access Program student. For all academic years, students
9 who have previously received awards under the provisions of the
10 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Act, ~~Section 2601 et seq. of this~~
11 ~~title,~~ and who have continued at all times to fulfill the
12 requirements for eligibility to receive awards provided pursuant to
13 this program shall be given an absolute priority for continued
14 financial support by the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program
15 superior to any students who are applying for such benefits for the
16 first time.

17 G. Any Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program student who has
18 received an award under the provisions of the Oklahoma Higher
19 Learning Access Act who fails to fully comply with the requirement
20 to continue to reside and work in the state for a minimum of five
21 (5) years after graduation as set forth in subsection C of Section
22 2603 of this title and in the agreement entered into pursuant to
23 subsection C of Section 2605 of this title shall pay to the Oklahoma
24 State Regents for Higher Education an amount equal to twenty percent

1 (20%) of the total amount of the scholarship awarded to the student
2 for every year the student failed to meet the five-year requirement.
3 In addition the student shall be required to pay interest on the
4 repayment amount at the rate of four percent (4%) from the date of
5 disbursement of the funds. Any amount received by the State Regents
6 for repayment of scholarship awards and interest pursuant to this
7 subsection shall be deposited in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access
8 Trust Fund. The State Regents shall promulgate rules for the
9 determination of student compliance with the residency and work
10 requirements.

11 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2001, Section 2605, as
12 last amended by Section 3, Chapter 437, O.S.L. 2009 (70 O.S. Supp.
13 2009, Section 2605), is amended to read as follows:

14 Section 2605. A. Each school year, every fifth- through ninth-
15 grade student in the public and private schools of this state and
16 students who are educated by other means and are in the equivalent
17 of the fifth through ninth grade shall be apprised, together with
18 the parent, custodial parent, or guardian of the student, of the
19 opportunity for access to higher learning under the Oklahoma Higher
20 Learning Access Program. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
21 Education and the State Board of Education shall develop, promote,
22 and coordinate a public awareness program to be utilized in making
23 students and parents aware of the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access
24 Program.

1 B. On a form provided by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
2 Education, every public school district shall designate at least one
3 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program contact person, who shall be
4 a counselor or teacher, at each public school site in this state in
5 which eighth-, ninth- or tenth-grade classes are taught. When
6 requested by the State Regents, the State Board of Education shall
7 assist the State Regents to ensure the designation of contact
8 persons. Private schools shall also designate at least one school
9 official as a contact person. For students who are educated by
10 other means, a parent or guardian or other person approved by the
11 State Regents shall be designated the contact person.

12 C. Students who qualify on the basis of financial need
13 according to ~~subsections~~ subsection D or E of this section and the
14 standards and provisions promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents
15 for Higher Education shall be given the opportunity throughout the
16 eighth-, ninth-, and tenth-grade years, for students enrolled in a
17 public or private school, or between the ages of thirteen (13) and
18 fifteen (15), for students who are educated by other means, to enter
19 into participation in the program by agreeing to, ~~throughout:~~

20 1. Throughout the remainder of their school years or
21 educational program:

22 ~~1. Attend~~

23 a. attend school or an educational program regularly and
24 do homework regularly~~7,~~

1 ~~2. Refrain~~

2 b. refrain from substance abuse~~†,~~

3 ~~3. Refrain~~

4 c. refrain from commission of crimes or delinquent acts~~†,~~

5 ~~4. Have~~

6 d. have school work and school records reviewed by
7 mentors designated pursuant to the program~~†,~~

8 ~~5. Provide~~

9 e. provide information requested by the Oklahoma State
10 Regents for Higher Education or the State Board of
11 Education~~†,~~ and

12 ~~6. Participate~~

13 f. participate in program activities; and

14 2. For students executing agreements after the end of the 2010-
15 2011 school year, upon graduation from an institution of higher
16 education or a postsecondary vocational-technical program or course,
17 remain a resident of and be employed in the state for not less than
18 five (5) consecutive years after the year of graduation.

19 The contact person shall maintain the agreements, which shall be
20 executed on forms provided by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
21 Education and managed according to regulations promulgated by the
22 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, and the contact person
23 shall monitor compliance of the student with the terms of the
24 agreement. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education are

1 authorized to process student agreements and verify compliance with
2 the agreements. Students failing to comply with the terms of the
3 agreement shall not be eligible for the awards provided in Section
4 2604 of this title.

5 D. Except as otherwise provided for in subsection E of this
6 section, a student shall not be found to be in financial need for
7 purposes of the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program if:

8 1. At the time the student applies for participation in the
9 Program during the eighth, ninth or tenth grade for students
10 enrolled in a public or private school, or between the ages of
11 thirteen (13) and fifteen (15), for students who are educated by
12 other means, the income from taxable and nontaxable sources of the
13 student's parent(s) exceeds Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per
14 year; and

15 2. At the time the student begins postsecondary education and
16 prior to receiving any Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program
17 benefit award, the income from taxable and nontaxable sources of the
18 student's parent(s) exceeds One Hundred Thousand Dollars
19 (\$100,000.00) per year.

20 The determination of financial qualification as set forth in
21 this paragraph shall be based on the income of the student, not the
22 income of the parent(s), if a student:

23 a. is determined to be independent of the student's
24 parents for federal financial aid purposes,

1 b. was in the permanent custody of the Department of
2 Human Services at the time the student enrolled in the
3 program, or

4 c. was in the court-ordered custody of a federally
5 recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal
6 Indian Child Welfare Act, at the time the student
7 enrolled in the program.

8 The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any student
9 who has received an Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit
10 award prior to the 2012-2013 school year.

11 E. 1. A student who was adopted between birth and twelve (12)
12 years of age while in the permanent custody of the Department of
13 Human Services, in the court-ordered custody of a licensed private
14 nonprofit child-placing agency, or federally recognized Indian
15 tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare Act, shall not
16 be found to be in financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Higher
17 Learning Access Program if at the time the student begins
18 postsecondary education and prior to receiving any Oklahoma Higher
19 Learning Access Program benefit award, the income from taxable and
20 nontaxable sources of the student's parent(s) exceeds One Hundred
21 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) per year. The provisions of
22 this paragraph shall not apply to any student who has received an
23 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the
24 2012-2013 school year.

1 2. A student who was adopted between thirteen (13) and
2 seventeen (17) years of age while in the permanent custody of the
3 Department of Human Services, in the court-ordered custody of a
4 licensed private nonprofit child-placing agency, or federally
5 recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child
6 Welfare Act, shall not be found to be in financial need for purposes
7 of the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program if at the time the
8 student begins postsecondary education and prior to receiving any
9 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award, the income
10 from taxable and nontaxable sources of the student's parent(s)
11 exceeds Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) per year. The
12 provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any student who has
13 received an Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award
14 prior to the 2012-2013 school year.

15 3. The determination of financial qualification as set forth in
16 this subsection shall be based on the income of the student, not the
17 income of the parent(s), if the student is determined to be
18 independent of the student's parents for federal financial aid
19 purposes. A determination of financial qualification shall not be
20 required for the student who meets the criteria set forth in this
21 subsection at the time the student applies for participation in the
22 program. The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any
23 student who has received an Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program
24 benefit award prior to the 2008-2009 school year.

1 F. The financial qualification of a student as set forth in
2 subsections D and E of this section shall be certified by the
3 contact person or by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education
4 on the agreement form provided by the Oklahoma State Regents for
5 Higher Education. The form shall be retained in the permanent
6 record of the student and a copy forwarded to the Oklahoma State
7 Regents for Higher Education.

8 G. Agreements shall be witnessed by the parent, custodial
9 parent, or guardian of the student, who shall further agree to:

10 1. Assist the student in achieving compliance with the
11 agreements;

12 2. Confer, when requested to do so, with the school contact
13 person, other school personnel, and program mentors;

14 3. Provide information requested by the Oklahoma State Regents
15 for Higher Education or the State Board of Education; and

16 4. Assist the student in completing forms and reports required
17 for program participation, making applications to institutions and
18 schools of higher learning, and filing applications for student
19 grants and scholarships.

20 H. Students who are enrolled in a school district located in
21 this state that serves students who reside in both this state and an
22 adjacent state pursuant to a contract as authorized in Section 5-
23 117.1 of this title, are in the eleventh and twelfth grades during
24 the 2006-2007 school year, and who were denied participation in the

1 program shall be allowed to enter or reenter into participation in
2 the program by entering into agreements as set forth in subsections
3 C and D of this section by June 1, 2008.

4 I. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall
5 promulgate rules for the determination of student compliance with
6 agreements made pursuant to this section.

7 J. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall
8 designate personnel to coordinate tracking of program records for
9 the years when students participating in the program are still in
10 the schools or are being educated by other means, provide staff
11 development for contact persons in the schools, and provide liaison
12 with the State Board of Education and local organizations and
13 individuals participating in the program.

14 K. The school district where an Oklahoma Higher Learning Access
15 Program student is enrolled when the student begins participation in
16 the program and any subsequent school district where the student
17 enrolls shall forward information regarding participation by the
18 student in the program to a school to which the student transfers
19 upon the request of the school for the records of the student.

20 L. Students participating in the Oklahoma Higher Learning
21 Access Program shall provide their social security number or their
22 student identification number used by their school to the Oklahoma
23 State Regents for Higher Education. The Regents shall keep the
24 numbers confidential and use them only for administrative purposes.

1 SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2010.

2 SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
3 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
4 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
5 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
