6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S.
8 2001, Section 150.7, as amended by Section 1, Chapter
9 42, O.S.L. 2002 (74 O.S. Supp. 2009, Section 150.7),
10 which relates to powers and duties of the Director of
the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation; expanding
scope of powers and duties; and providing an
effective date.

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13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2001, Section 150.7, as
15 amended by Section 1, Chapter 42, O.S.L. 2002 (74 O.S. Supp. 2009,
16 Section 150.7), is amended to read as follows:

17 Section 150.7 The Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of
18 Investigation shall have the following powers, duties and
19 responsibilities:

20 1. To appoint or dismiss a Deputy Director who shall have the
21 same qualifications as the Director;

22 2. To supervise the maintaining of all reports and records of
23 the Bureau and to promulgate administrative rules concerning the
24 destruction and retention of such records. Such records shall not

1 be transferred to the custody or control of the State Archives
2 Commission or be subject to the provisions of Section 590 of Title
3 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The Director may, pursuant to adopted
4 and promulgated administrative rule, order destruction of records
5 deemed to be no longer of value to the Bureau, excluding
6 criminalistic and investigative records which shall forever be kept
7 and maintained;

8 3. To report to the Commission at each regular meeting, or as
9 directed by the Commission, the current workload of the Bureau.

10 Such reports shall be submitted by category of the persons or
11 entities authorized to initiate investigations as provided for in
12 subsection A of Section 150.5 of this title, and any other category
13 the Commission may request which does not violate the
14 confidentiality restrictions imposed in Sections 150.1 through 152.9
15 of this title. Such reports shall contain the following
16 information:

- 17 a. what types of investigations are pending,
- 18 b. what new types of investigations have been opened,
- 19 c. what types of investigations have been closed, and
- 20 d. what criminal charges have been filed as a result of
21 Bureau investigations.

22 The reports shall not contain any information on the individual
23 subjects of the investigation or persons questioned in connection
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1 with an investigation. These reports shall be open for public
2 inspection;

3 4. To designate positions, appoint employees and fix salaries
4 of the Bureau, other than the salaries established by subsection A
5 of Section 150.6a of this title, and to authorize the payment of
6 necessary certification expenses for the employees; and

7 5. To authorize the purchase and issuance of uniforms for all
8 law enforcement officers, criminalists, and other personnel of the
9 Bureau as designated by the Director and to purchase and issue
10 necessary equipment for all employees of the Bureau. All uniforms
11 and equipment shall be used only in the performance of the official
12 duties of the officers, criminalists or other personnel and shall
13 remain the property of the Bureau except as otherwise provided by
14 law; and

15 6. Directly accept on behalf of the Bureau monies, gifts,
16 grants or services from any public or private source.

17 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2010.
