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6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to motor vehicles; creating the Stop
8 Big Brother Act; prohibiting departments or agencies
9 from allowing entities access to databases that
10 contain certain information; prohibiting law
11 enforcement agencies from installing certain device
without court order; providing for the installation
of certain device under certain circumstances;
providing for codification; providing for
noncodification; and declaring an emergency.

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14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
16 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

17 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Stop Big
18 Brother Act".

19 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-110.4 of Title 47, unless
21 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 A. No department or agency of the state charged with motor
23 vehicle registration or operation, the issuance or renewal of driver
24 licenses, or the issuance or renewal of any identification cards

1 shall allow access, by any other entity, to databases containing
2 personal identification information, that would result in the
3 searching of such databases with any biometric technology, for the
4 purpose of making biometric identification. No other entity shall
5 have direct or indirect access to multiple records that contain
6 physical representations of individuals, where such access could be
7 used for biometric searches. No agreement shall be entered into
8 with any entity that may facilitate such access and no surveillance
9 camera, that is in a public place, except related in the issuance of
10 a driver license or identification card, shall be in any way
11 connected, directly or indirectly to such databases, by any entity,
12 including the department or agency charged with the issuance of said
13 documents.

14 B. No law enforcement agency in this state shall be allowed to
15 install, or facilitate the installation of, a tracking device or
16 device capable of transmitting data when scanned on any privately
17 owned motor vehicle without a court order.

18 C. The provisions of this act shall not be construed as
19 preventing the owner of a privately owned motor vehicle from
20 installing such a device or consenting to the installation of such a
21 device.

22 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
23 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
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1 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
