6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S.  
8 2001, Section 840-2.26, as amended by Section 4,  
9 Chapter 176, O.S.L. 2005 (74 O.S. Supp. 2009, Section  
10 840-2.26), which relates to the Oklahoma Personnel  
11 Act; defining term; and providing an effective date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2001, Section 840-2.26, as  
14 amended by Section 4, Chapter 176, O.S.L. 2005 (74 O.S. Supp. 2009,  
15 Section 840-2.26), is amended to read as follows:

16 Section 840-2.26 A. In order to provide increased services to  
17 the public, to assist state employees in meeting the needs of their  
18 families, improve employee morale and productivity, appointing  
19 authorities are encouraged to consider the adoption of flextime  
20 attendance policies and alternative work schedules.

21 B. For purposes of this section, "flextime" means a regular,  
22 eight-hour-day work schedule that permits the use of alternative  
23 starting and ending times within limits set by the appointing  
24 authority and that includes a common work period during which all

1 employees are expected to be present, and "alternative work  
2 schedules" means a compressed four day work week at ten (10) hours a  
3 day.

4 C. The Administrator of the Office of Personnel Management  
5 shall provide technical assistance to agencies in developing  
6 flextime policies and alternative work schedules and shall  
7 promulgate rules pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act as  
8 necessary for such policies.

9 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2010.
