6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to public health and safety; defining  
8 term; creating the Oklahoma Invisible Bracelet pilot  
9 program; requiring cooperation of Oklahoma Health  
10 Care Authority; specifying requirements; requiring  
11 report; providing for codification; and providing an  
12 effective date.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7150 of Title 63, unless there  
16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 A. 1. As used in this section, "Invisible Bracelet" shall mean  
18 a Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA)  
19 compliant Internet web-based service that provides vital health  
20 information about participants in medical emergencies so that  
21 Emergency Medical Service providers may better treat the participant  
22 and be aware of any history or health condition of the participant  
23 which may complicate treatment efforts.

24 2. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority and the State Department  
of Health, hereinafter referred to as the Authority and the

1 Department, respectively, are hereby directed to establish an  
2 invisible bracelet pilot program for the citizens of the state.

3 3. The Authority and the Department shall establish interagency  
4 cooperative agreements to implement and administer the pilot  
5 program.

6 4. The Authority and the Department shall model the Invisible  
7 Bracelet pilot program on the Invisible Bracelet program developed  
8 for state employees by the Oklahoma Employees Benefits Council.

9 5. The pilot program shall operate within funds appropriated by  
10 the Legislature.

11 B. The roles and responsibilities of the Authority and the  
12 Department include, but are not limited to:

13 1. Assessing the effectiveness of the program as reported by  
14 both participants and Emergency Medical Service providers;

15 2. Determining the feasibility of expanding the program state-  
16 wide; and

17 3. Providing a report to the Legislature no later than November  
18 1, 2011 which summarizes the effectiveness of the program and a  
19 detailed cost benefit analysis.

20 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2010.
