9 AS INTRODUCED

10 An Act relating to the Department of Mental Health  
11 and Substance Abuse Services; requiring budgeting in  
12 certain categories and amounts; requiring certain  
13 performance measures; providing for duties and  
14 compensation of employees; limiting salary of the  
15 Commissioner; providing budgetary limitations; and  
16 providing an effective date.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, the  
19 Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services shall  
20 budget all funds in the following categories and amounts:

3 The agency shall develop outcome-based performance measures for  
4 each budget category.

5 SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not  
6 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed  
7 upon the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services by  
8 law shall be set by the Commissioner of the Department of Mental  
9 Health and Substance Abuse Services. The salary of the Commissioner  
10 of the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services  
11 shall not exceed \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$0.00) per annum, payable monthly  
12 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010. The Department of Mental  
13 Health and Substance Abuse Services for the fiscal year ending June  
14 30, 2010, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on  
15 full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding  
16 expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be  
17 authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of  
18 the Oklahoma Statutes:
