AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to professions and occupations; creating the General Contractor Registration Act; providing short title; defining terms; requiring contractor registration for projects of certain value; limiting causes of action; designating Secretary of State as registrar; allowing promulgation of rules and forms; allowing use of certain technology; providing procedure for registration; requiring certain documents with application; authorizing additional information; requiring certain statements under oath; stating grounds for refusal to grant contractor registration; requiring certain notice and opportunity to cure defects in application within certain time; allowing reapplication after certain waiting period; establishing notice and grounds for registration not in good standing; prohibiting certain acts after certain notification; providing suspension for certain prohibited acts; construing effect of prior convictions; providing for criminal history record search and fee under certain circumstance; requiring certain compliance for contractor; stating registration fee; directing deposit of moneys to certain fund for certain purpose; providing prorated fee and term for certain registrations; setting renewal fee; making certain exceptions to registration; construing certain authority; establishing authority to issue contractor registration; setting expiration dates for registration; requiring certain fee and notification for information changes; prohibiting certain information change; exempting certain business entities from certain notification procedure; providing renewal procedure; setting renewal fee and date; allowing exchange of certain information with certain agencies; requiring certain information for

renewal; providing for nonrenewal; providing a grace period for renewal; setting late fee for renewal; providing for suspension and revocation for nonrenewal; setting fee for suspended and revoked registrations; requiring status notation in certain contractor record; allowing public inspection of contractor registration; directing destruction of records after certain date; authorizing certified copies of registration as prima facie evidence; setting fee record certification; allowing abstract of certain record for certain purpose; providing complaint procedure; including complaint information in certain record; providing complaint may be grounds for certain action; directing registrar to refer certain complaints to Attorney General or district attorney; prohibiting registrar to resolve complaints; allowing registrar to suspend or revoke registration for certain term; prohibiting registration under another name during certain period; creating misdemeanor penalty for certain acts; setting fine; providing for restitution; providing for revocation of contractor registration; allowing permanent revocation; designating registrar as service agent for nonresident contractors; providing procedure for service of process; exempting certain business entities from appointment of certain legal service agent; allowing court continuance before default judgment for certain contractor; requiring contractor and subcontractor registration number on certain permits; directing registrar to verify contractor information to certain officials; authorizing use of technology for certain verification system; allowing information sharing for certain purposes; construing provisions and authority of act; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.1 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "General Contractor Registration Act".

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.2 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

DEFINITIONS.

2.2

As used in this act:

- 1. "General Contractor" means any individual or business entity that satisfies both of the following:
 - a. For compensation, directs, supervises, or has responsibility for the means, method, and manner of construction, improvement, renovation, repair, or maintenance on a construction project with respect to one or more trades and who offers, identifies, or otherwise holds out or represents that the individual or business entity is permitted or qualified to perform, direct, supervise, or have responsibility for the means, methods, and manner of construction, improvement, renovation, repair, or maintenance with respect to one or more trades on a construction project; and
 - Performs or employs tradespersons or persons in a licensed trade who perform construction, improvement,

renovation, repair, or maintenance on a construction project with respect to the contractor's trades.

- 2. "Licensed trade" means a trade performed by a plumbing contractor, mechanical contractor or electrical contractor licensed in this state pursuant to law regulating the profession;
- 3. "Tradesperson" means an individual employed by a contractor who engages in construction, improvement, renovation, repair, or maintenance of buildings or structures without assuming responsibility for the means, method, or manner of that construction, improvement, renovation, repair, or maintenance;
- 4. "Construction project" means a job, plan or design for construction, improvement, renovation, repair, or maintenance of a building or structure solicited, directed, supervised or performed by a licensed trade, contractor or tradesperson;
- 5. "Nonresident contractor" means any contractor as defined in paragraph 1 of this section who has not established and maintained a place of business as a contractor in this state within the preceding year, or who claims residency in another state, or who has not submitted an income tax return as a resident of this state within the preceding year;
- 6. "Person" includes any individual, firm, partnership, association, corporation, limited liability company, or other group or combination thereof acting as a unit, and the plural as well as

- the singular number, unless the intent to give a more limited meaning is disclosed clearly by the context thereof;
- 7. "Public contract" means a contract with the State of Oklahoma, its political subdivisions, or any board, commission, or department thereof, or with any board of county commissioners, or with any city council, school board, or with any state or municipal agency, or with any other public board, body, commission, or agency authorized to offer or award contracts for the construction or reconstruction of public work and includes subcontracts undertaken to perform works covered by the original contract or any part thereof; and
- 8. "Registrar" means the Secretary of State of the State of Oklahoma.
 - SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.3 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

REGISTRATION REQUIRED.

A person may not engage in the business nor act in the capacity of a general contractor within this state when the cost, value, or price per job exceeds the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) nor may that person bring or maintain any claim, action, suit, or proceeding in any court of this state related to the person's business or capacity as a general contractor without a valid registration as provided in this act.

SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.4 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

REGISTRAR DESIGNATED.

The Secretary of State is hereby designated registrar under the provisions of this act and as registrar has authority to employ such assistance and procure such records, supplies, and equipment as may be necessary to carry out and implement the provisions of this act. The Secretary of State may promulgate rules, forms, policy and procedures to implement the provisions of this act. The Secretary of State may administer any provision of this act through use of the Internet or other technology as deemed necessary or appropriate.

SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.5 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

REGISTRATION - FAILURE TO GRANT - REVOCATION.

A. To obtain a general contractor registration under this act, an applicant who is eighteen (18) years of age or older shall submit, on forms the registrar prescribes, an application under oath containing a statement of the applicant's experience and qualifications as a general contractor, if any, and a copy of any other contractor or licensed trade credentials issued in this state. A copy of the contractor's certificate of liability insurance must be filed with the application. In addition, the contractor must

submit proof that the contractor has secured workers' compensation coverage satisfactory under the Workers' Compensation Act, or, if exempt, a statement of exemption. If the registrar deems it appropriate or necessary, the registrar may also require other information to assist the registrar in registering the person as a contractor. The application must contain statements that the applicant desires the issuance of a general contractor registration certificate; that the applicant will comply with the provisions of this act; that the applicant will comply with state laws and local ordinances relating to contractor or licensed trades, standards and permits; that the applicant is not, and has not been, required to register as a sex offender in this state or any other state; and that the nonresident applicant appoints the Secretary of State as legal service agent for all lawful process to be served upon the applicant for work performed in this state.

- B. The registrar may refuse to register any person if the registrar determines:
- 1. The application contains false, misleading, or incomplete information;
- 2. The applicant fails or refuses to provide any information requested by the registrar;
 - 3. The applicant fails or refuses to pay the required fees;
- 4. The applicant is ineligible for registration due to a prior suspended or revoked registration in this state;

- 5. The applicant is required to register, or has been required to register, as a sex offender in this state or another state;
- 6. The applicant has failed to obtain or maintain any other contractor or licensed trade credential as required by law; or

- 7. The applicant has failed or refuses to submit any taxes due in this state.
- C. The registrar shall notify the applicant in writing if the registrar does not grant a registration or renewal certificate, and shall provide the applicant an opportunity to respond to or cure any defect in the written application or renewal for a period of ten (10) days from the date of the written notification. An applicant aggrieved by a decision of the registrar not to grant a registration or renewal may appeal the decision as provided in the Administrative Procedures Act, or the applicant may reapply after a ninety-day waiting period, if otherwise eligible under the provisions of this act. The application and renewal fees shall not be refundable.
- D. Upon obtaining knowledge that a general contractor may have violated any provision of this act, the registrar shall notify the contractor of the alleged violation. No sooner than twenty (20) days after sending written notice to a contractor at the contractor's last-known address, the registrar shall classify as not in good standing the registration of any contractor who fails to:

1. Maintain liability insurance coverage;

- 2. Maintain workers' compensation coverage satisfactory under
 the Workers' Compensation Act;
 - 3. File, renew, or properly amend any fictitious name certificate;

- 4. Maintain an active status of a corporation or registration as a foreign corporation, a limited liability company or registration as a foreign limited liability company, a limited liability partnership registration or foreign limited liability partnership registration, or a limited partnership certificate or limited partnership or foreign limited partnership certificate of authority;
 - 5. File or renew a trade name registration;
- 6. Maintain or renew a contractor registration as provided in this act;
 - 7. Notify the registrar of a change in name, address, legal business entity, legal service agent, registration as a convicted sex offender, or adjudication of guilt by a court of competent jurisdiction for any violation of this act;
 - 8. Obtain or maintain a trade license as required by law for certain professions; or
 - 9. File and pay all taxes when due in this state.
- E. Any general contractor who has been notified by the
 registrar that the contractor's registration is not in good standing
 shall cease soliciting or entering new projects as of the date of

such notification. If the contractor fails to correct the deficiency specified in the notice by evidence satisfactory to the registrar within thirty (30) days of the date of the notice or if the contractor solicits or enters new projects while the contractor's license is not in good standing, the registrar shall proceed to suspend the registration of the contractor for one (1) year.

SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.6 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

CONVICTION NOT BAR TO REGISTRATION - EXCEPTIONS.

Conviction of an offense does not disqualify a person from registration as a contractor under this act unless the Secretary of State determines that the offense has a direct bearing upon a person's ability to serve the public as a general contractor or the person is, or has been, required to register as a sex offender in this state or any other state. A determination of the Secretary of State that a conviction is a bar to eligibility for registration under this act shall be a final decision for purposes of registration under this act. The registrar shall not be required to conduct a criminal history records search on any applicant; however, upon written request, the registrar may require the applicant to submit to a criminal history records search and to pay the necessary fees to conduct such records search. In the case of a required

criminal history records search, no original registration or renewal
shall be granted until the records search is completed and deemed
satisfactory by the registrar for registration under this act.

SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.7 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE.

The holder of a general contractor registration certificate is entitled to engage in the contracting business within this state pursuant to the provisions of this act and subject to the following limitations:

- 1. A general contractor's registration certificate number must be valid at the time of soliciting a project and during subsequent job performance, and shall not be suspended, revoked or deemed not in good standing by the registrar;
- 2. A general contractor's registration certificate number must be submitted when applying for a permit issued by the state, or any of its political subdivisions, for commercial or residential projects and must be written upon each permit issued;
- 3. A general contractor's registration certificate cannot be shared or used by any other individual or business entity; provided, however, a business firm, partnership, association, corporation, limited liability company, or other group or combination thereof acting as a unit may be granted a single registration certificate

- 1 number for use by designated contractors acting as agents for the business entity when the application for registration contained sufficient information on each member, partner, officer and agent 3 and the registrar issued a single certificate number to such persons 4 as a unit;
- Upon any change to the name, address, business entity, legal 6 service agent or criminal history record of a general contractor, 7 the registrar must be notified;
- 9 5. A general contractor must comply with state laws and local 10 ordinances relating to licensed trades, standards and permits, unless lawfully exempt; and 11
- 12 6. A contractor must pay tax obligations when due in this state. 13
- SECTION 8. A new section of law to be codified NEW LAW 14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.8 of Title 59, unless there 15 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 16

REGISTRATION FEE.

- At the time of making application for a general contractor registration certificate under in this act, the applicant shall pay to the registrar a fee in the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00).
- All moneys collected by the registrar for contractor registration applications, renewals and other fee assessments shall be deposited by the registrar and credited to the Revolving Fund for the Office of the Secretary of State ("200 Fund") and such funds

- 1 shall be used by the Office of the Secretary of State to implement and administer the provisions of this act.
 - The fee to be submitted with an application for a contractor registration shall be prorated to Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for only those applications received between January 1, 2011, and April 30, 2011; and, thereafter, the fee shall be as stated in subsection A of this section.
- D. A renewal fee for a contractor registration shall be Thirty-9 five Dollars (\$35.00).
- A new section of law to be codified 10 SECTION 9. NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.9 of Title 59, unless there 11 12 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

- This act does not apply to: Α. 14
 - Except as provided herein, any authorized employee, representative or representatives of the United States government, the State of Oklahoma, or any county, municipality, or other political subdivision of this state;
 - 2. Any person who furnishes any fabricated or finished product, material, or article of merchandise which is not incorporated into or attached to real property by such person so as to become affixed thereto; and
- 3. Except as provided herein, any public contract for 23 construction or reconstruction of public works.

B. The provisions of this section shall not be construed to preclude any administrative or governing body with authority to offer or enter into public contracts, although the project may be exempt from the registration requirement of this act, from requiring an individual contractor registration for purposes of such person submitting or entering into any bid process or contract.

SECTION 10. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.10 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

DUTY OF REGISTRAR - EXPIRATION OF LICENSE.

Within fifteen (15) days from the date of application, the registrar shall determine whether the applicant has met the requirements to act in the capacity of general contractor as defined in this act, and no registration shall be issued to an applicant until the registrar receives all documentation and fees necessary to obtain a registration certificate. The registration certificate issued on an original application entitles the person to act as a general contractor within this state, subject to the limitations of this act, until the expiration of the then current fiscal year ending June 30, except that an initial registration issued in May or June is valid until June 30 of the subsequent year. A prorated registration certificate issued between January 1, 2011, and April 30, 2011, shall be valid until June 30, 2011.

SECTION 11. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.11 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

SECTION 12.

Not later than ten (10) days after the date of a change in a contractor's name, address or legal service agent, or upon a registered contractor ceasing business as a general contractor, or upon a requirement to register as a sex offender, the person must notify the registrar of the change on a form provided by the registrar. A name, address, or legal service agent change must be accompanied by a fee of Ten Dollars (\$10.00). A person may not change his or her name under an active registration certificate if the change is associated with a change in the legal status of the business entity other than a change in marital status. Doing business under a new business name or a change in legal status of a business requires issuance of a new registration certificate. a registered contractor ceases to be active as a general contractor, the registrar must suspend the registration certificate of such contractor. A corporation, limited liability company, limited liability partnership, or limited partnership registered with the Secretary of State is not subject to this section.

- Any registration certificate issued under this act may be renewed for each successive fiscal year by obtaining from the registrar a certificate of renewal. To obtain a certificate of renewal, the person shall file with the registrar a renewal application by June 30 and pay the renewal fee. The application for renewal shall require a listing of each project, contract, or subcontract completed during the preceding calendar year in this state over the amount of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00), if any, and a statement that the applicant has submitted income and employment taxes due in this state. The registrar may forward a copy of any information in an application for renewal to the Oklahoma Tax Commission and any other state agency, and may include all or part of such project listing for public inspection. applicant must include with the renewal application a copy of the certificate of liability insurance, unless the registrar has a current valid certificate of insurance on file, proof of workers' compensation coverage, unless exempt under the Workers' Compensation Act, and, if applicable, a copy of any licensed trade credential required by law for certain professions. The renewal application need not be notarized.
- B. The registrar may refuse to renew a general contractor registration certificate for any reason stated in Subsection B of Section 5 of this act. The registrar shall notify the applicant in

writing if the registrar does not grant the renewal as provided in subsection C of Section 5 of this act. The registrar may request additional information when deemed appropriate to renew the contractor.

- C. If any contractor fails to file a renewal application by the June 30 deadline, that contractor's registration is not in good standing and the contractor must be deemed to be not registered within the meaning of this act. A general contractor has a thirty-day grace period after June 30 to renew the registration certificate without a late fee. The late fee is Ten Dollars (\$10.00). A contractor registration certificate not renewed by August 30 must be suspended, and on January 1, if a registration certificate still has not renewed, it must be revoked.
- D. 1. A contractor desiring to renew a registration certificate that has been suspended shall be assessed a fee equal to twice the amount of the fee stated in subsection D of Section 8 of this act.
- 2. The registrar shall assess a reinstatement fee of One
 Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) plus the fee required by Section 8 of this
 act for any registration that has been revoked.
- 3. A contractor submitting an application for registration after suspension or revocation of a general contractor registration certificate must be otherwise eligible for registration under this act.

E. The registrar shall include a registration status notation in a contractor's record if the status of registration changes to not in good standing, suspended or revoked.

SECTION 13. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.13 of Title 59, unless there

RECORDS.

2.2

The registrar shall maintain in the registrar's office, open to public inspection during normal office hours, a complete indexed record of all general contractor registrations and information maintained on individual contractors. The registrar may dispose of an inactive contractor file after three (3) years. Before disposal and upon written request, the registrar shall furnish a certified copy of any information maintained on an individual contractor upon receipt of the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each annual record. Each certified copy of a contractor record from the registrar shall be received in all courts in this state as prima facie evidence of the facts stated therein. The registrar may condense or provide an abstract of a contractor's record for public inspection at any time for purposes of data management; provided, a complete record is available for public inspection upon written request.

SECTION 14. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.14 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

COMPLAINTS.

2.2

- A. Any person may file a duly verified complaint with the registrar alleging that the person has committed any of the following acts or omissions:
- 1. Abandonment of a contract without legal excuse after a deposit of money or other consideration has been paid;
 - 2. Diversion of funds or property entrusted to a contractor;
- 3. Engaging in any fraudulent or deceptive acts or practices or misrepresentation as a contractor;
- 4. Making a false or misleading statement in an application for contractor registration or renewal or violating any provision of this act;
- 5. Conviction of an offense which prohibits the person from registration as a contractor or affects the ability of the person to serve the public as a contractor;
- 6. Engaging in work without a licensed trade credential as required for certain professions pursuant to local, state, or federal law; or
 - 7. Failure to pay income or employment taxes.
- B. The complaint must be on a form approved by the registrar and must set forth sufficient facts upon which a reasonable person could conclude that any of the acts or omissions in subsection A of this section has been committed.

C. A complaint may constitute grounds for the Attorney General or district attorney to bring an action against the person registered as a contractor or against any person not registered who is engaging in the business or acting in the capacity of a contractor in violation of the provisions of this act.

SECTION 15. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.15 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF REGISTRATION.

- A. The registrar shall review each complaint received and may include for public inspection all or part of the information contained in a complaint when the registrar deems it to be in the best interests of the public. If the registrar determines a written complaint provides sufficient facts upon which a reasonable person could conclude that one or more of the acts or omissions set forth in Section 14 of this act has been committed, the registrar shall refer the complaint to the Attorney General or appropriate district attorney for investigation or other disposition. The registrar has no authority to resolve complaints.
- B. If a general contractor is adjudicated by a court of competent jurisdiction to be guilty of an act or omission in violation of this act, the registrar shall revoke the contractor's registration for one (1) year or as otherwise ordered by the court. During the pendency of any judicial proceedings for any violation of

- this act, the registrar may suspend a contractor's registration, or,
 in the case of a person who is not registered as required in this
 act, refuse to issue a registration to such person, for a period of
 one (1) year or until the preceding is adjudicated or dismissed,
 whichever is longer.
 - C. The registrar may not renew, reinstate, or issue a new registration to any person adjudicated guilty of a violation of the provisions of this act until the suspension or revocation period has terminated and the person makes application and pays required fees pursuant to Sections 8 and 12 of this act.
 - D. No person shall attempt to obtain a general contractor registration certificate under any other name during any period when the contractor's registration is suspended or revoked. A business firm, partnership, association, corporation, limited liability company, or other group or combination thereof acting as a unit whose registration certificate is suspended or revoked includes any members, partners, officers, and agents acting under that registration certificate.
 - SECTION 16. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.16 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 CRIMINAL PENALTY.

On and after January 1, 2011, any person acting in the capacity of a general contractor without a valid registration certificate as

a general contractor pursuant to this act, or any person whose registration certificate is not in good standing, suspended or revoked and who continued to act in the capacity of a contractor in violation of the provisions of this act, shall, upon conviction, be quilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not exceeding Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00). In addition, the court may order restitution to be paid to any person whose property is damaged by the acts or omissions of the person convicted. The court may order the registration certificate of a defendant to be revoked for not more than five (5) years or to be permanently revoked, at the discretion of the court. In the event the court does not set a specific period of revocation for a defendant's contractor registration certificate, the Secretary of State as registrar for the General Contractor Registration Act shall revoke the registration for one (1) year as provided in subsection B of Section 15 of this act.

SECTION 17. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.17 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

NONRESIDENT CONTRACTORS.

Every applicant for a general contractor's registration who is a nonresident contractor as defined by this act, by signing and filing the application, appoints the Secretary of State as the applicant's true and lawful agent upon whom may be served all lawful process in

any action or proceeding against such nonresident contractor for construction projects performed in this state. Such appointment in writing is evidence of the contractor's consent that any such process against the contractor which is so served upon the Secretary of State shall be of the same legal force and affect as if served upon the contractor personally within this state. Registered foreign corporations, registered foreign limited liability companies, foreign limited liability partnerships and foreign limited partnerships entitled to do business in the state and having a current registered agent and registered address on file in the Office of the Secretary of State need not appoint the Secretary of State as agent for service of process under this section. ten (10) days after service of the summons upon the Secretary of State, notice of such service with the summons and complaint in the action shall be sent to the defendant contractor at the defendant contractor's last-known address by registered or certified mail with return receipt requested and proof of such mailing shall be attached The Secretary of State shall keep a record of all to the summons. process served upon the Secretary of State under this section, showing the day and hour of service. Whenever service of process was made under this section, the court, before entering a default judgment, or at any stage of the proceeding, may order such continuance as may be necessary to afford the defendant contractor

reasonable opportunity to defend any action pending against the defendant contractor.

SECTION 18. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.18 of Title 59, unless DUTY TO SUPPLY REGISTRATION NUMBER.

When applying for any permit required by the state or any of its political subdivisions for contractor jobs, a general contractor shall supply the permit-issuing official that contractor's registration certificate number issued pursuant to this act. That official shall enter a contractor's registration number on the permit. A person performing as a contractor on his or her own property, although exempt from the registration requirements of this act, shall, when applying for a permit required for the project, supply the permit-issuing official each person's licensed trade credential number, as soon as available, and each employee's and subcontractor's credentials, if any, engaged on the project and doing work covered by the permit. That official shall enter each licensed trade credential and any contractor registration number so supplied before inspection of the job.

SECTION 19. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.19 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

CONTRACTOR LIST.

Upon request, the registrar shall verify a general contractor registration number to city and county enforcement officials. The registrar may establish through the Internet or other technology a verification system for contractor registration certificates maintained by the Office of the Secretary of State. Whenever the registrar obtains information on the activities of a general contractor, or other person required to be registered or have a licensed trade credential, doing business in this state of which officials of any state agency or local enforcement official may be unaware, and that may be relevant to the duties of such agency or official, the registrar shall provide the relevant information to those officials and agencies for the purpose of administering and enforcing official duties.

SECTION 20. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.20 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

This act shall be construed to be in addition to, and not in lieu of, any licensed trade credential for persons performing certain professions and trades in this state, and further, this act shall not be deemed to conflict with or affect the authority of any state or local agency, board or commission whose duty and authority is to administer or enforce any law or ordinance or to establish, administer or enforce any policy, rule, qualification or standard for any licensed trade or profession.
