6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S.
8 2001, Section 85.12c, which relates to the Department
9 of Human Services; exempting certain fund-raising
10 revenues and donations from Central Purchasing Act;
11 requiring certain deposits; and providing an
12 effective date.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2001, Section 85.12c, is
15 amended to read as follows:

16 Section 85.12c A. Purchases made from funds received by local
17 offices administered by the Department of Human Services for fund-
18 raising activities and donations for the benefit of clients and
19 potential clients at the local offices where such purchases may not
20 otherwise be paid for from appropriated funds, shall not be subject
21 to requirements of the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. Monies
22 received by such fund-raising activities or donations shall be
23 maintained in an Agency Special Account, and expenditure control
24 shall reside at the local offices. Monies received by such fund-
raising activities or donations from the local office, vending

1 operations administered by employees of the Department of Human
2 Services, and all other nonrestricted cash and cash-equivalent items
3 received by employees of the Department of Human Services shall be
4 deposited in the Agency Special Account established for this
5 purpose. Such deposits shall be made at local banking institutions
6 approved by the State Treasurer.

7 B. Purchases made from funds received by local offices
8 administered by the Office of Juvenile Affairs for fund-raising
9 activities and donations for the benefit of clients and potential
10 clients at the local offices where such purchases may not otherwise
11 be paid for from appropriated funds shall not be subject to
12 requirements of the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. Monies
13 received by such fund-raising activities or donations shall be
14 maintained in an agency special account, and expenditure control
15 shall reside at the local offices. Monies received by such fund-
16 raising activities or donations from the local office, vending
17 operations administered by employees of the Office of Juvenile
18 Affairs, and all other nonrestricted cash and cash-equivalent items
19 received by employees of the Office of Juvenile Affairs shall be
20 deposited in the agency special account established for this
21 purpose. The deposits shall be made at local banking institutions
22 approved by the State Treasurer.

23 C. Merchandise for resale purchased and sold through a canteen
24 established at an institution or facility operated by the Office of

1 Juvenile Affairs shall be exempt from the requirements of the
2 Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act.

3 D. Purchases and solicitations made from funds or assets
4 received in accordance with Section 2-106 of Title 43A of the
5 Oklahoma Statutes and administered by the Department of Mental
6 Health and Substance Abuse Services shall not be subject to
7 requirements of the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. Monies
8 received by such activities or donations shall be maintained in an
9 Agency Special Account, and expenditure control shall reside in a
10 trust created by the Department and with oversight by the Department
11 of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services Board. Such deposits
12 shall be made at local banking institutions approved by the State
13 Treasurer.

14 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2010.

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
