AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission; requiring budgeting in certain categories and amounts; requiring certain performance measures; providing for duties and compensation of employees; limiting salary of the Director; providing budgetary limitations; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission shall budget all funds in the following categories and amounts:

3 The agency shall develop outcome-based performance measures for
4 each budget category.

5 SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not
6 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed
7 upon the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission by law shall
8 be set by the Director. The salary of the Director shall not exceed
9 _____ Dollars (\$0.00) per annum, payable monthly for the
10 fiscal year ending June 30, 2010. The Alcoholic Beverage Laws
11 Enforcement Commission for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010,
12 shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-
13 time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures
14 for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized
15 pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the
16 Oklahoma Statutes:
