6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to crimes and punishment; creating
8 offenses for criminal use of certain fireworks;
9 designating penalty for offenses; providing for
10 codification; and providing an effective date.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 652.1 of Title 21, unless there
14 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 A. Every person who, with intent to do bodily harm and without
16 justifiable or excusable cause, commits any assault, battery, or
17 assault and battery upon the person of another by shooting or
18 detonating at another, with a Class B firework defined pursuant to
19 Section 1622 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes or other means
20 whatever, with intent to cause great bodily injury, or to commit any
21 felony, upon conviction, is guilty of a felony punishable by
22 imprisonment in the State Penitentiary not exceeding five (5) years,
23 or by imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding one (1) year.

1 B. Every person who, with intent to do bodily harm and without
2 justifiable or excusable cause, commits any assault, battery, or
3 assault and battery upon the person of another by shooting or
4 detonating at another, with a firework defined pursuant to Section
5 1630 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes or other means whatever,
6 with intent to cause death or to commit any felony, upon conviction,
7 is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the State
8 Penitentiary not exceeding twenty (20) years.

9 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2010.
