6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S.
8 2001, Section 840-2.24, which relates to specialized
9 disaster relief services; authorizing leave time for
10 participation in Civil Air Patrol disaster services;
11 encouraging private employers to participate in
12 volunteer disaster service programs; making language
13 gender neutral; encouraging school districts to
14 participate in volunteer disaster service programs;
15 and providing an effective date.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2001, Section 840-2.24, is
18 amended to read as follows:

19 Section 840-2.24 A. 1. As used in this subsection, "disaster"
20 means disasters designated at level III and above in the American
21 Red Cross Regulations and Procedures.

22 2. Any state employee in the executive branch of state
23 government who is a certified disaster service volunteer of the
24 American Red Cross or a member of the United States Air Force
Auxiliary Civil Air Patrol, with the authorization of the chief
executive officer of ~~his~~ the state agency, may be granted a leave

1 with pay not to exceed fifteen (15) working days in any twelve-month
2 period to participate in specialized disaster relief services within
3 the State of Oklahoma for the American Red Cross or the United
4 States Air Force Auxiliary Civil Air Patrol, upon the request of the
5 American Red Cross or the United States Air Force Auxiliary Civil
6 Air Patrol and with the approval of the office of the Governor of
7 this state, without the loss of pay, annual leave, sick leave,
8 accrued overtime wages or compensatory time. The agency shall
9 compensate an employee granted leave time under this section at his
10 or her regular rate of pay for those regular work hours during which
11 the employee is absent from work.

12 3. Notwithstanding the provision of paragraph 2 of this
13 subsection, state employees certified as disaster volunteers shall
14 not exceed five hundred (500) participants at any one time. A list
15 of such employees will be coordinated with the Department of Civil
16 Emergency Management and the office of the Governor of this state.
17 Within sixty (60) days of any request made by the American Red Cross
18 or the United States Air Force Auxiliary Civil Air Patrol, a report
19 shall be prepared by the American Red Cross or the United States Air
20 Force Auxiliary Civil Air Patrol and submitted to the Governor's
21 office stating the reasons and needs for any request made.

22 B. Any state officer or employee in the executive branch of
23 state government authorized by the employing agency of the officer
24 or employee to volunteer in a disaster relief activity during a

1 presidentially declared national disaster in Oklahoma after May 1,
2 1999, for a period of not more than six (6) months after the date of
3 the presidentially declared national disaster, shall not have to use
4 accrued leave or need to make up any time due to the performance of
5 their volunteer activities.

6 C. Private employers are encouraged to allow their employees to
7 take leave in order to participate in volunteer disaster service
8 programs.

9 D. School administrators are encouraged to allow students,
10 sixteen (16) years of age or older to be out of school to
11 participate in volunteer disaster service programs.

12 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2010.
