7 An Act relating to officers; requiring disclosure of
8 relationship to certain persons; requiring disclosure
9 of certain records by private prisons; providing for
10 codification; and providing an effective date.

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12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 321.1 of Title 51, unless there
15 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 A. Any elected official, members of the state judiciary, state
17 law enforcement agents, District Attorneys Council members,
18 Assistant District Attorneys, Board of Corrections members, or
19 Department of Corrections employees involved with private prisons,
20 including, but not limited to, having a direct or indirect business
21 relationship, any ownership interest, any regulatory authority, any
22 board representation, or imposition of criminal sentences, shall
23 disclose and report to the State Ethics Commission any such
24 relationship. Persons heretofore identified in this subsection

1 shall also disclose any of the above-identified business
2 relationships of any family member within the third degree of
3 consanguinity and affinity. Such disclosure shall be maintained in
4 a record by the Commission and shall be made available upon request.

5 B. All private prisons in the state shall disclose records,
6 available under the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. § 552),
7 regarding owners, stockholders, and investors, to the Ethics
8 Commission upon request.

9 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2010.

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
