5 AS INTRODUCED

6 An Act relating to state government; amending Section
7 2, Chapter 463, O.S.L. 2005, as last amended by
8 Section 2, Chapter 208, O.S.L. 2007 (74 O.S. Supp.
9 2008, Section 3601.2), which relates to chief
10 executive salaries; updating year; removing certain
11 entity from chief executive salary listing; providing
12 an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 2, Chapter 463, O.S.L.
15 2005, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 208, O.S.L. 2007 (74
16 O.S. Supp. 2008, Section 3601.2), is amended to read as follows:

17 Section 3601.2 A. Beginning January 1, ~~2007~~ 2009, the agency,
18 board, commission, department or program shall establish the salary
19 of each of the chief executive officers for which they have
20 appointing authority. Such salary shall be set between the minimum
21 and maximum of the range specified below, for full-time employees
22 only, per annum, payable monthly, pursuant to the limitations
23 outlined below:

24 1. If the chief executive officer's salary is below the minimum
annual salary then it can not be raised to more than the minimum

1 annual salary in one (1) fiscal year. If the chief executive
2 officer's salary is at or above the minimum annual salary then the
3 salary may not be increased above the midpoint in one (1) fiscal
4 year.

5 2. Such increases shall not occur more than once in a fiscal
6 year; and

7 3. The salary of the incumbent chief executive officer shall
8 not be increased if the officer's salary exceeds the maximum of the
9 range.

21 B. All increases require certification of the appointing
22 authority that said action can be implemented for the current fiscal
23 year and subsequent fiscal year without the need for additional
24 funding. The agency, board, commission, department or program shall

1 report increases granted under this section to the Office of
2 Personnel Management on an annual basis by August 1 of each year.
3 The Office of Personnel management shall forward a report of such
4 increases to the Governor, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and
5 Speaker of the House of Representatives no later than September 1 of
6 each year.

7 C. Every two (2) years starting FY-05, the Office of Personnel
8 Management shall review these salary ranges and report on and make
9 recommendations on proposed salary ranges in their annual
10 compensation reports mandated by paragraph 5 of Section 840-1.6A of
11 this title by no later than December 1.

12 D. Every three (3) years the Legislature shall review the
13 salary ranges specified in subsection A of this section.

14 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2009.

15 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
16 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
17 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
18 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
