6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to professions and occupations;  
8 permitting long-term care pharmacies to maintain  
9 emergency electronic medication kits; directing use  
10 of electronic medication kits; directing the Oklahoma  
11 State Board of Pharmacy to promulgate certain rules;  
12 defining terms; providing for codification; and  
13 providing an effective date.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 367.8 of Title 59, unless there  
17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 A. A long-term care pharmacy may maintain controlled dangerous  
19 substances in an emergency electronic medication kit used at a  
20 facility. The controlled dangerous substances may be used only for  
21 the emergency medication needs of a resident at the facility. A  
22 long-term care pharmacy may maintain drugs in an emergency  
23 medication kit for any facility.

1 B. The Oklahoma State Board of Pharmacy shall promulgate rules  
2 relating to emergency medication kits, including, but not limited  
3 to:

4 1. The amount and type of controlled dangerous substances that  
5 may be maintained in an emergency medication kit;

6 2. Procedures regarding the use of drugs from an emergency  
7 medication kit;

8 3. Recordkeeping requirements; and

9 4. Security requirements.

10 C. As used in this section:

11 1. "Facility" means a facility as defined by the Nursing Home  
12 Care Act or an assisted living center as defined by the Continuum of  
13 Care and Assisted Living Act; and

14 2. "Long-term care pharmacy" means a licensed pharmacy which is  
15 not open to the general public and which primarily provides pharmacy  
16 services to institutions.

17 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2009.
