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6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to public health and safety; amending
8 63 O.S. 2001, Section 1-119, which relates to the
9 Oklahoma Health Care Information System Act;
10 expanding information to be collected; requiring
11 certain report; providing for codification; and
12 providing an effective date.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2001, Section 1-119, is
15 amended to read as follows:

16 Section 1-119. A. 1. The Division of Health Care Information
17 within the State Department of Health shall, with the advice of the
18 Health Care Information Advisory Committee and in accordance with
19 the rules of the State Board of Health, collect health care
20 information from information providers.

21 2. The information to be collected about information providers
22 may include, but shall not be limited to:

- 23 a. financial information including, but not limited to,
24 consumption of resources to provide services,

- 1 reimbursement, costs of operation, revenues, assets,
2 liabilities, fund balances, other income, rates,
3 charges, units of service, wage and salary data,
4 b. service information including, but not limited to,
5 occupancy, capacity, and special and ancillary
6 services,
7 c. physician and other health care professional profiles
8 in the aggregate by clinical specialties and nursing
9 services,
10 d. discharge data including, but not limited to,
11 completed discharge data sets or comparable
12 information for each patient discharged from the
13 facility after the effective date of this act, ~~and~~
14 e. ambulatory care data including, but not limited to,
15 provider-specific and encounter data, and
16 f. cost data on plant operations, equipment, pharmacy and
17 medical devices, and other direct or indirect costs to
18 the facility.

19 3. The Division shall implement a demonstration project for the
20 voluntary submission of ambulatory care data, including, but not
21 limited to, submissions from federally qualified health centers,
22 migrant health programs and rural health clinics as defined in Title
23 3 of the Federal Public Health Service Act (PL 104-299), and the
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1 Oklahoma Health Care Authority. The Division shall complete the
2 demonstration project by January 1, 2002.

3 4. The Division shall establish a phase-in schedule for the
4 collection of health care data. The phase-in schedule shall provide
5 that prior to January 1, 1994, only data currently collected shall
6 be required to be submitted to the Division. Thereafter, in the
7 collection of health care data, the Division shall whenever possible
8 utilize existing health data resources and avoid duplication in the
9 collection of health care data.

10 5. Except as provided by Section 1-120 of this title and as
11 otherwise authorized by the provisions of the Oklahoma Health Care
12 Information System Act, the provisions of the Oklahoma Health Care
13 Information System Act shall not be construed to lessen or reduce
14 the responsibility of the information provider with regard to:

- 15 a. the accuracy of the data or information submitted,
- 16 b. liability for release of the data or information to
17 the Division, data processor or as otherwise
18 authorized by this section, or
- 19 c. the preservation of confidentiality of such data or
20 information until submitted to the Division.

21 B. Upon the request of the State Department of Health, every
22 state agency, board or commission shall provide the Division of
23 Health Care Information with the health care data and other health
24 care information requested at no charge to the Department or the

1 Division. Except as otherwise provided by the Health Care
2 Information System Act for the purpose of statistical and similar
3 reports, information which is required by state or federal law to be
4 confidential shall not be transferred to any entity by the Division
5 unless a separate written agreement for such transfer has been
6 executed with the state agency, board or commission providing the
7 information to the Division.

8 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
9 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-120.1 of Title 63, unless
10 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

11 On or before December 31, 2010, and annually thereafter, the
12 Division of Health Care Information within the State Department of
13 Health shall publish a report which itemizes expenditures in the
14 health care industry. At a minimum, the report shall include
15 information on:

16 1. The total pay for licensed health care professionals in the
17 state by work setting;

18 2. The total pay for unlicensed health care professionals in
19 the state by work setting;

20 3. The total cost of plant operations and equipment for health
21 care facilities in the state by work setting;

22 4. The total cost of pharmacy and medical devices for health
23 care facilities in the state by work setting; and

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1 5. The total cost of other direct or indirect costs for health
2 care facilities by work setting.

3 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2009.

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
