6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to public health and safety;
8 specifying duties of the Oklahoma Health Information
9 Security and Privacy Collaboration; providing for
10 codification; and providing an effective date.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in
13 the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-722.1 of Title 63, unless there is
14 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 The Oklahoma Health Information Security and Privacy
16 Collaboration (OKHISPC) shall evaluate potential barriers to the
17 broad adoption of standards-based electronic health information
18 systems, including electronic health records and statewide health
19 information exchange. These barriers may include, but are not
20 limited to:

- 21 1. Broadband access;
22 2. Penetration;
23 3. Capacity;

1 4. Application program interface availability and development;
2 and

3 5. Health information technology (HIT) systems acquisition and
4 ongoing operational costs, including hardware, software, licensing,
5 support staff, and training expenses.

6 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2009.
