9 AS INTRODUCED

10 An Act relating to Oklahoma Department of Emergency
11 Management; requiring budgeting in certain categories
12 and amounts; requiring certain performance measures;
13 providing for duties and compensation of employees;
14 limiting the salary of the Director; providing
15 budgetary limitations; and providing an effective
16 date.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, the
19 Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management shall budget all funds
20 in the following categories and amounts:

22 Administration	\$0.00	\$0.00
23 Operations	<u>0.00</u>	<u>0.00</u>

The agency shall develop outcome-based performance measures for
each budget category.

1 SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not
2 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed
3 upon the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management by law shall be
4 set by the Director. The salary of the Director of the Oklahoma
5 Department of Emergency Management shall not exceed
6 _____ Dollars (\$0.00) per annum, payable monthly for the
7 fiscal year ending June 30, 2010. The Oklahoma Department of
8 Emergency Management for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010, shall
9 be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-
10 equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for
11 capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant
12 to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma
13 Statutes:
