6 AS INTRODUCED

7 A Resolution honoring the victims of the Oklahoma
8 City bombing; thanking Church Women United in
9 Oklahoma for their commemoration; and directing
10 distribution.

12 WHEREAS, on Monday, April 19, 2010, there will be several
13 ceremonies held in remembrance of the fifteenth anniversary of the
14 bombing of the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City,
15 Oklahoma. However, one memorial service will be held a day early.
16 On Sunday, April 18, 2010, at 2:30 p.m. on the South Plaza of the
17 Oklahoma State Capitol in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, the Church Women
18 United in Oklahoma will display their Ribbon of Tangible Hope in
19 commemoration of the fifteenth anniversary of this tragic event; and

20 WHEREAS, the Ribbon of Tangible Hope is created with countless
21 panels of cloth showing peoples' expressions of love for their
22 world, protection for that which is endangered on earth, and what
23 represents a culture of peace. The cloth panels measure three feet
24 by one and one-half feet with a tie on each corner so they can be

1 easily joined together. The representations of cloth are decorated
2 using sewing, painting or other mediums displaying appropriate
3 messages or symbols; and

4 WHEREAS, Church Women United (CWU) is a national volunteer
5 Christian ecumenical women's movement. It is a movement that brings
6 together women of diverse races, cultures, and traditions in closer
7 Christian fellowship, prayer, advocacy, and action. CWU engages
8 women representing seventeen supporting denominations and
9 participating Christian women in the State of Oklahoma.

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION
11 OF THE 52ND OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

12 THAT the Oklahoma State Senate joins with Church Women United in
13 honoring the victims and those whose loved ones were victims of the
14 bombing in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, fifteen years ago.

15 THAT the Oklahoma State Senate welcomes Church Women United to
16 the Oklahoma State Capitol and thanks them for commemorating this
17 sorrowful event.

18 THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to Lynne Bussell,
19 Church Women United in Oklahoma.
