**Bill Summary**

SAHB for HB 1025 prohibits sex offenders from engaging in ice cream truck vending. The amendment also requires ice cream truck companies to conduct annual name searches against the Oklahoma Sex Offender Registry prior to allowing employees to engage in ice cream truck vending. The amendment makes it a misdemeanor for failure to conduct the name searches, maintain records and report violations to the district attorney.

**Fiscal Analysis**

SAHB to HB 1025 requires that any sex offender convicted of engaging in ice cream truck vending be punished by up to two and one-half years imprisonment and/or a fine up to \$1,000. Any person convicted and sentenced to a term of imprisonment would cost the state approximately \$55 per day for each day of incarceration. The fiscal impact of SAHB for HB 1025 would be dependent upon the number of persons sentenced to a term of incarceration and the length of the sentence.
