Bill Summary

The Floor Substitute for HB2332 adds language giving the Director of the Department of Central Services (DCS) the authority and responsibility to implement a policy to approve the ability of state government entities to accept the terms of service for usage of social media services and contract for technology products and services provided the terms of service contain standard language including a liability agreement which is considered customary or largely similar to terms of service agreed to or contracts entered into by other government entities and private sector enterprises.

The amendment also requires that only those competitive bids submitted to the state for goods and services in excess of \$5000 contain a certification. Currently all competitive bids regardless of cost require one.

Finally the amendment also adds institutions of higher education to the list of entities required to provide a list of all state purchasing card transactions.

HB2332 amends the Central Purchasing Act to require all expenditures for postage to be made to the United States Post Office.

The bill also clarifies that DCS remove all *data* from electronic storage media from all surplus information technology and communication equipment before it is sold, donated, stored or destroyed. It further qualifies that the electronic storage media DCS is responsible for destroying is that media the department itself processed.

The measure further requires all expenditures for postage to be made to the United States Post Office and provides that the Department of Central

Services (DCS) is responsible for paying for the destruction of electronic storage media for equipment that is processed by the agency.
