Bill Summary

The introduced version of HB2650 limits the immunity provided to an employer in a workers' compensation claim. The bill prohibits extending immunity to an employer if an employee's injury resulted from the "willful intention" of the employer. "Willful intention" is defined as the employer committing a deliberate act with the intent of causing injury or an existing dangerous condition presenting a high risk of injury, where the employer was aware of the condition. The bill also establishes what constitutes a claim for willful intention and what will not suffice.

Fiscal Summary

HB2650 prohibits immunity from liability in workers' compensation cases if an employer committed a conscious voluntary and deliberate act with the specific intent of causing injury to an employee.
