Bill Summary

The introduced version of HB2721 amends the Uniform Parentage Act by requiring that a proceeding brought by a presumed father, the mother, or another individual to adjudicate the parentage of a child having a presumed father to commence within one year from the discovery of a fraud perpetrated upon a presumed father. Furthermore, if a child has an acknowledged or adjudicated father, an individual who seeks an adjudication of paternity of the child must commence a proceeding within one year from discovery of a fraud perpetrated upon the individual.
