**Bill Summary**

The Committee Substitute for HB 2920 establishes the Oklahoma Maternal-Infant Quality Care Collaborative to implement ways to provide mothers and newborns quality health care and improve infant health outcomes.

**Fiscal Summary**

HB 2920 in its current form, creates the “Oklahoma Maternal-Infant Quality Care Act” and creates a Collaborative to run through December 31, 2015. The Collaborative shall include the State Commissioner of Health (OSDH), the Director of the Department of Human Services (DHS), the Commissioner of Mental Health and Substance Abuse (ODMSAS), the Director of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority (OHCA), the Director of the Oklahoma University Health Sciences Center Office of Perinatal Continuing Education (OPCE), and 7 appointed members. The measure provides for reimbursement of travel expenses for members of the Collaborative. The automatic members are to be reimbursed by their employing agencies and the appointed members are to be reimbursed by OSDH. The measure also states that OSDH shall provide support staff for the Collaborative.

**Fiscal Analysis**

OSDH estimates an annual cost of \$8,000 associated to the staffing and reporting requirements imposed by the measure. OSDH also estimates a \$700 per meeting cost to reimburse the appointed members of the Collaborative. DHS, ODMSAS, OHCA and OPCE are expected to experience minimal costs associated with travel reimbursement.
