**Bill Summary**

House Bill 3126 requires that the Oklahoma Partnership for School Readiness Board also serve as the state's Early Childhood Advisory Council. The bill also expands the number of board members from fourteen to fifteen by adding the state director of Head Start Collaboration as a member of the board.

**Fiscal Summary**

HB 3126, as introduced, expands the duties of the Oklahoma Partnership for School Readiness Board by designating the Board as Oklahoma's Early Childhood Advisory Council to fulfill responsibilities set forth in the Head Start Act.

**Fiscal Analysis**

There are no costs associated with this measure, as the Board, also known as Smart Start Oklahoma, already serves as the state's Early Childhood Advisory Council (by gubernatorial designation). The addition of one Council member makes state statutes correspond to federal statutes, but does not impact the state.
