Bill Summary

Research Analyst: Dusty Darr

This measure provides that the selling of fireworks will not be considered an act in violation of a declared burn ban. In addition, the measure modifies existing law by providing that a burn ban resolution passed by a board of county commissioners be effective for no longer than thirty (30) days from the date of passage. Under current law, a burn ban resolution is only effective for a period of up to seven (7) days from the date of passage by a board of county commissioners.

The committee substitute for HB 3210 increases the time an extreme fire danger resolution passed board of county commissioners lasts and exempts the selling of fireworks from being considered an act in violation of burning prohibitions.
