**Fiscal Summary**

The 2nd CCS for 3311 provides that every act of the Legislature shall contain a separate provision that clearly expresses the subject of the bill. In the event a court of this state determines that a legislative measure violates the one-subject rule of the Oklahoma Constitution, the court shall provide written findings that detail each of the multiple subjects the court has determined are contained within such measure. The 2nd CCS also provides that an agency, when promulgating rules to facilitate administration of legislative policy on behalf of the Oklahoma Legislature, shall include a separate provision that clearly expresses the subject of the rule finally adopted for purposes of ensuring compliance with the Oklahoma Constitution. Section 3 of the measure stipulates that the Administrative Procedures Act delegates the Oklahoma Legislature's rulemaking authority to executive branch agencies for the purpose of eliminating the necessity of establishing every administrative aspect of general public policy through legislation. In the event a court of this state determines that an administrative rule promulgated under the provisions of Sections 250.1 through 323 of Title 75 of the Oklahoma Statutes violates the one-subject rule of the Oklahoma Constitution, the court shall provide written findings that detail each of the multiple subjects the court has determined are contained within such an administrative rule.
