Bill Summary

The PCS for Engrossed SB 1036 removes two legislative members from a task force created to study smoking in public places for the purpose of:

- Examining state laws related to smoking in public places;
- Examining the health effects associated with smoking and the economic impact of smoking bans on local business; and
- Providing recommendations on ways to improve state laws on smoking in public places.

The measure requires the task force to submit its findings and recommendations to the legislature and the governor by November 30, 2009.

Fiscal Summary

The FULLPCS1 for ESB 1036 is new language creating a twelve-member task force to study smoking in public places, specifies composition of the task force, requires staff support by the Oklahoma State Department of Health (OSDH), requires a report by November 30, 2009, and provides for travel reimbursement in accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

Fiscal Analysis

Based on historical data related to travel reimbursements for advisory committees or task forces, the anticipated fiscal impact of the FULLPCS1 for ESB 1036 will be \$1,200 per meeting. The total impact of this legislation will be dependent on the number of meetings held and the cost of providing staff support for the task force by OSDH. The cost of providing staff support will be dependent upon the number of personnel required and the number of hours needed to prepare materials for the task force.
