Bill Summary

The Proposed Committee Substitute for Engrossed SB 1133 provides that a certified registered nurse anesthetist (CRNA) is not prohibited from administering an epidural steroid injection under the timely onsite supervision of a physician and prohibits a CRNA from operating a freestanding pain management facility without direct supervision of a qualified physician. The measure defines “interventional pain management” as the practice of medicine devoted to the diagnosis and treatment of chronic pain and limits the practice to allopathic and osteopathic physicians.

Fiscal Summary

The Proposed Committee Substitute for SB 1133 contains both new and amendatory language creating the Oklahoma Interventional Pain Management and Treatment Act. This legislation provides that a certified registered nurse anesthetist (CRNA) is not prohibited from administering a lumbar intra-laminar epidural steroid injection under the supervision of a physician and prohibits a CRNA from operating a freestanding pain management facility without direct supervision of a qualified physician. The Proposed Committee Substitute also makes it unlawful to practice interventional pain management in the state unless duly licensed under the provisions of the Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision Act or the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act.

Fiscal Analysis

The costs associated with the Proposed Committee Substitute for SB 1133 will be limited to the minimal cost of promulgating rules by the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners and the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision. The cost of promulgating the rules will have no fiscal impact on appropriated funds, because both these entities are non-appropriated state agencies and receive all their revenue from license fees and fines.
