The CCS for SB 1179 amends the Oklahoma Chiropractic Practice Act by increasing the cost of an application fee from \$150 to \$175 and the cost of an examination fee from \$150 to \$175. This legislation also increases the cost of an original license for relocation of a practice in another state to practice chiropractic in this state from \$300 to \$350.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The CCS for SB 1179 will have no fiscal impact on appropriated agencies or appropriated funds, because the increase in revenues generated by these changes will not go to General Revenue. These fees go to a revolving fund to support the functions of the Board of Chiropractic Examiners, which is a non-appropriated state agency and receives only revenue from fees and fines.
