**Bill Summary**

The engrossed version of SB1231 creates a task force to study the Mutualization or Privatization of CompSource. The task force will examine the issues as they relate to creating a domestic mutual company or privatizing CompSource while serving as an assured market source for workers' compensation insurance, a competitive force in the marketplace and remain a quasi-state agency. The task force shall publish its findings and recommendations by December 1, 2009.

**Fiscal Summary**

The engrossed version of SB 1231 creates the Task Force on Mutualization or Privatization of CompSource Oklahoma. The purpose of the task force is to study creating a domestic mutual company or privatizing CompSource Oklahoma, while keeping it a quasi-state agency. The Senate and House will provide staff support and members of the task force will receive travel reimbursement.

**Fiscal Analysis**
