**Bill Summary**

The Committee Substitute restores the title on Engrossed SB1234, which clarifies that an employer or company that has an Affidavit of Exempt Status Under the Workers' Compensation Act from a person executing the affidavit is in compliance with Workers' Compensation Act and the employer or company shall not be responsible for workers' compensation claims made by the executor.

**Fiscal Summary**

The committee substitute for SB 1234 deals with the provision of law that requires an Affidavit of Exempt Status Under the Worker's Compensation Act, which is to be filed with the Insurance Department. The execution of the affidavit shall provide that an individual or company in possession of the affidavit is in compliance and therefore not responsible for workers' compensation claims made by the executor.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The provisions of the measure provide no significant impact to state revenues or expenditures.
