Bill Summary

The committee substitute for SB1756 authorizes the Supreme Court to continue to have exclusive control of the Supreme Court courtroom and robing room (in the west wing of the 2nd floor) and modifies reference to the spaces the Court of Criminal Appeals has access to as the Presiding Judge deems necessary, removing the authority of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court to determine Court of Criminal Appeals necessity.

The committee substitute also retains the Engrossed language that clarifies that the Legislature is permitted to allow agencies of the executive or judicial departments to use space within the State Capitol Building that is under the Legislature's management and control. The measure gives the Legislature management and control of the space in the State Capitol Building currently managed by the Oklahoma Capitol Complex and Centennial Commemoration Commission.

The title and enacting clause are off the bill.

Fiscal Summary

The Committee Substitute for ESB 1756 relates to the management and control of space in State Capitol Building. The measure provides that the Supreme Court shall continue to have exclusive management and control of the Supreme Court courtroom and designated robing room located in the west wing of the second floor and the Court of Criminal Appeals shall continue to have access to the courtroom and designated robing room located in the north wing of the second floor upon such occasions as the Presiding Judge of the Court of Criminal Appeals deems necessary and appropriate. The measure also allows the Legislature to permit agencies of the executive or judicial departments to use space within the State Capitol Building that is under its management and control of the Legislature; and transfers management and control of space in the State Capitol Building currently managed by the Oklahoma Capitol Complex and Centennial Commemoration Commission to the Legislature.

Fiscal Analysis

In its present form, there is no impact on state revenues and resources under the provisions of the Committee Substitute for ESB 1756.
