**Bill Summary**

The engrossed version of SB2037 states that the Department of Central Services will provide an Oklahoma State flag to any member of the United States Armed Forces who is either killed in the line of duty or dies of wounds inflicted who, at the time of death, was a resident of the state. The bill also mandates that prior to the flag being sent to the deceased's spouse of parents, the Department must alert the deceased's State Senator and State Representative.

**Fiscal Summary**

ESB 2037 directs The Department of Central Services (DCS) beginning November 1, 2010, to furnish an Oklahoma state flag to any member of the United States Armed Forces, including the National Guard or Armed Forces reserve, who is either killed in the line of duty in a combat zone or dies of wounds inflicted in a combat zone and who, at the time of death, was a resident of this state or whose surviving spouse, or parents if no surviving spouse, are residents of this state. The Oklahoma flag shall be mailed by DCS to the surviving spouse or parents.

**Fiscal Analysis**

DCS anticipates that the costs associated with this measure would be minimal: \$12.25 for a 3x5 nylon flag and approximately \$10.00 for shipping, for a total of \$22.25 per flag sent to each family.
