SB 2070 in its current form, modifies licensing prohibitions for architects, landscape architects, podiatric physicians, cosmetologists, dentists, funeral directors, professional engineers, land surveyors, allopathic physicians, athletic trainers, athletic apprentices, nurses, realtors, real estate appraisers, physical therapists, occupational therapists, bail bondsmen, psychologists, pawnbrokers, speech-language pathologists, audiologists, professional counselors, marital and family therapists, licensed behavioral practitioners. Currently such individuals are disqualified from such occupational licensing if convicted of a felony; the measure modifies what types of felony convictions would disqualify an individual as well as provides for an appeals process.

Fiscal Analysis

The number of individuals newly eligible for licensing under the measure is believed to be minimal. No significant amount of revenue or expenses, on behalf of the affected boards and agencies, is anticipated based on the eligibility and appeals process modifications made by the measure. SB 2070 in its current form, is expected to have no direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
