**Bill Summary**

The conference committee substitute to Senate Bill 2199 restores the title and removes the requirement that school districts reimburse employees for the cost of a national criminal history record search.

The measure allows boards of education to request from the State Board of Education a national criminal history record check of any employee of the school.

**Fiscal Summary**

SB 2199 requires school districts to request national criminal history record checks to be performed for any person seeking employment with the school.

**Fiscal Analysis**

School districts were previously authorized to request such searches, but they were not mandatory. Any search required payment of \$50 by the employee or prospective employee to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, then the district reimbursed the employee pending search results. As the search fee remains at \$50, this would represent the cost to districts for any future search, if the district opts to reimburse a prospective employee.
