Bill Summary

The committee substitute restores the title for SB 290, which provides that when a student earns college credit through concurrent enrollment, school districts will provide academic credit for any concurrently enrolled higher education courses that are correlated with the academic credit. The academic credit will be transcribed as elective credit if there is no correlation between the concurrent enrollment higher education course and a course provided by the school district.

Fiscal Summary

Fiscal Analyst: Nicole Barnes

The proposed committee substitute for ESB 290 requires school districts to provide academic credit for any concurrently enrolled higher education courses that have a correlation to an academic credit granted by the institution of higher education, and to transcript as elective only when there is no correlation with any course provided by the school district.

As the measure requires neither additional course offerings nor state appropriations, there is no associated impact.
