Bill Summary

The Committee Substitute restores the title to Engrossed SB 572 and removes the requirement that regulations adopted by a city, town or county that relate to food or drink establishments be identical to the rules for such establishments adopted by the State Board of Health. The measure requires that local regulations or ordinances related to the protection of the public health be subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Health and that they not be more stringent than state laws or rules of the State Board of Health and exempts certain rules related to food managers and food handlers adopted prior to May 31, 2008.

Fiscal Summary

The CS for SB 572 is amendatory language related to the powers and duties of county boards of health. This legislation stipulates that regulations adopted by county boards of health shall not be more stringent than state law and rules. The CS for SB 572 also provides that rules and fees adopted by county boards of health prior to May 31, 2008, and related to food managers and food handlers shall be exempt from the provisions of this legislation.

Fiscal Analysis

Based on information provided by the Oklahoma State Department of Health, the provisions of the CS for SB 572 will have no fiscal impact on appropriated agencies or appropriated funds.
