Bill Summary

The Committee Substitute restores the title to SB829, which amends the Travel Reimbursement Act to provide for the reimbursement of the actual costs of gasoline used for travel in certain circumstances. In addition, the measure makes clerical changes to the Act.

Fiscal Summary

Fiscal Analyst: Terry McKenna

The Committee Substitute for SB 829 provides that persons who are not state employees, but who are performing substantial and necessary services to the state may be reimbursed for the actual cost of gasoline expended in furtherance of authorized state business.

Fiscal Analysis

The language related to the reimbursement of actual gasoline costs is permissive; thus, in its present form there is no significant fiscal impact on state revenues or resources under the provisions of the Committee Substitute for SB 829.
